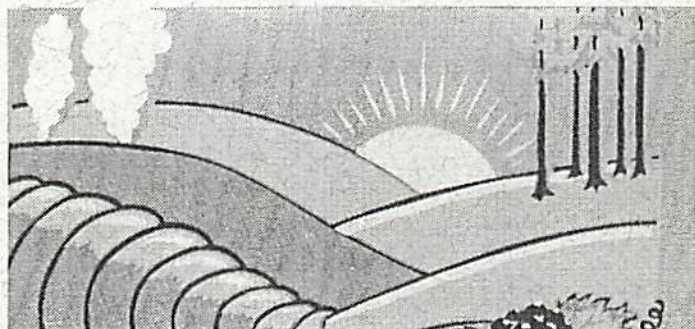

Expenditures listed for the social services building will total about \$2,000 more once all bills are paid.

The Steele Lane figure includes some estimates of final costs for the project, and assumes some costs will be paid by \$6,000 from the Santa Rosa School District. Two backstops planned are now expected to cost more than \$3,000 budgeted and will probably have to be funded with coming fund raisers.

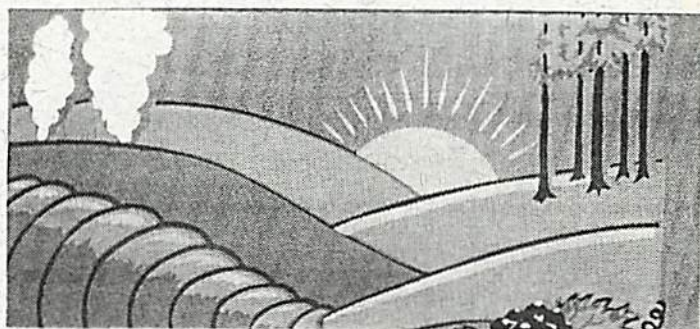

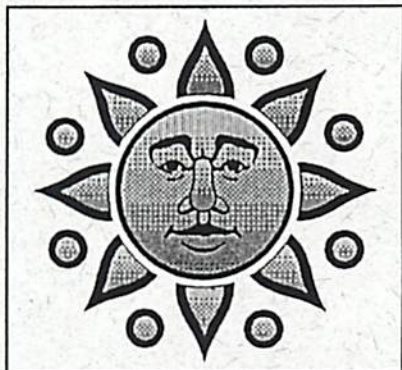
"Tropical Paradise" fall fund raiser starts today.

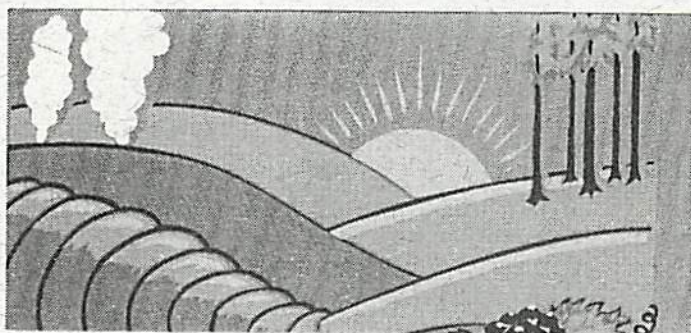

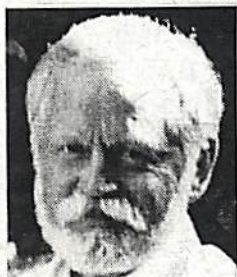

Petaluma stockbroker Jerry Price had the opportunity of a lifetime last year when he was on the "Americans on Sagarmantha '95" expedition to Mt. Everest.

He had climbed progressively higher peaks in previous years, including 22,834-foot Mt. Aconcagua. He had hiked 221-mile John Muir Trail in a record eight and one half days and had run double marathons (52 miles) to train for the ascent up the world's highest peak.

He'll tell of his adventures to become the oldest man to climb Mt. Everest -- at age 61.

Price has been a broker with Robert Thomas Securities Inc. since 1990. He is the past president of two San Francisco Lions Clubs and is a director of the Petaluma Host Lions Club.

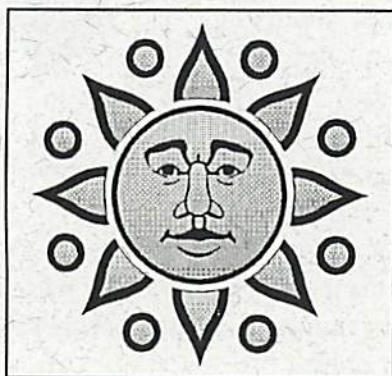


Tropical Paradise

A team effort -- What started six years ago as an effort by the four Rotary Clubs of Santa Rosa to focus on youths, and emerging youth-related problems in the community, has grown to an incredible program helping hundreds of students and families each month.

Here's the impact now, according to Dr. John Palmer, a Rotarian who chairs the SOS counseling committee:

--The collaborative project has expanded from three schools to 13 elementary schools, 3 middle schools and 2 high schools.

--From six counselors to 18.

-- From 40 hours of service to families and students to 200 hours each week.

-- From a budget of \$10,000 to \$100,000; from 100% Rotary funded to 16% Rotary funded (we started and others jointed).

-- The program for 1996-97 will grow even more.
