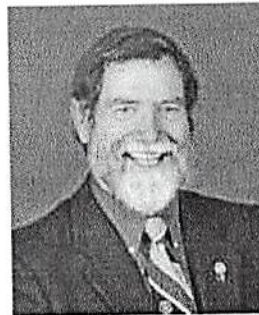

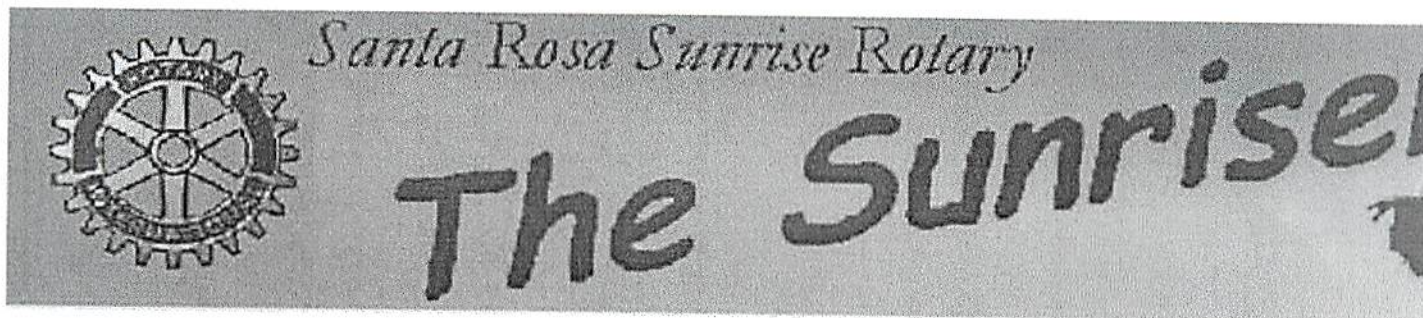

Charlie we welcome you back anytime. Come casual!

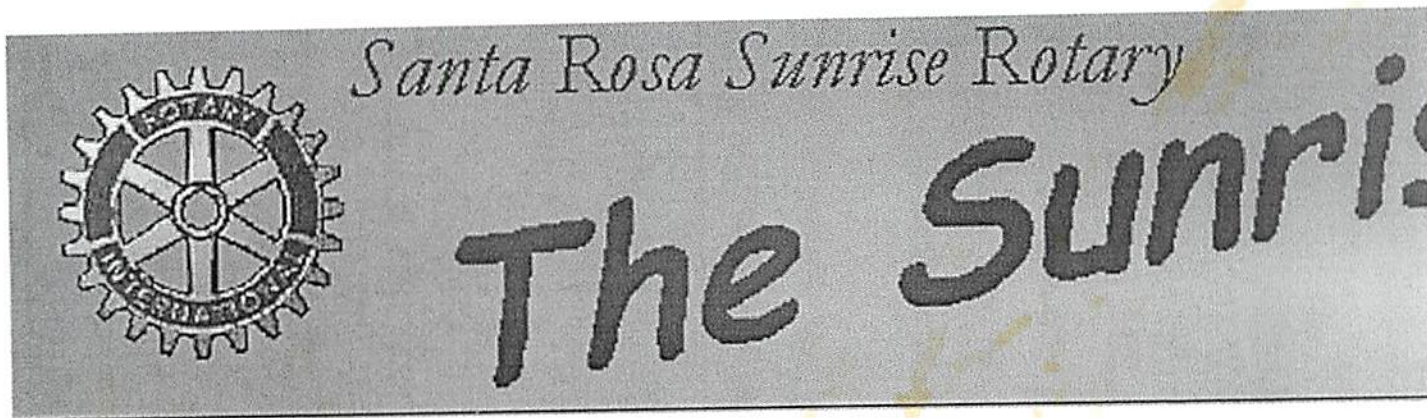
