## THANK YOU MIKE BRADY, JOHN REGUR, AND SALLY BROWN



While we greatly appreciate the Avalon's gracious hosting of our club meetings ever since the 2013 flood forced us from the Spice of Life Event Center, it was a joyous thing to be at our new location---the Boulder JCC. We have John Regur, Sally Brown, and especially Mike Brady to thank for all the work they did searching for, identifying, and then working out the details for our new location. Our new meeting room is light (but not too bright!), airy, spacious, and beautiful, and also inspirational (see Bill Moore's recap of Friday's talk on that from JCC Executive Director Jonathan Lev).

And President Bill looked like a motivational speaker up there on stage on Friday!

## PRESIDENT BILL REVIEWS PROGRESS TOWARD OUR GOALS

At Friday's meeting, President Bill updated us with March's review of goals achieved: we have completed 16 projects and we have eight to ten projects currently in process (journaling, for example, is not yet finished for the year). For service hours, for which the goal is 2000, we have 797.5 logged so far. Our good works funding goal is \$80,000, and we are close to that with \$75,384 contributed so far this Rotary year. We have contributed \$8,048 to Polio Plus, which is good, but let's keep contributing! We have work to do regarding our contributions to the Rotary Foundation: our goal is \$35,000 but we have only given \$16,885.

#### MIKE BRADY'S CLUB SECRETARY REPORT

At the March Board meeting, the board reviewed the finance and membership numbers,

reviewed liaison reports from vocational service and the Foundation, reviewed the contract with the JCC and the contract with Spice of Life, reviewed progress on the garage sale, and approved the use of the scanner for recording attendance at future meetings. In addition, the board discussed having a new focus for district grants and decided to have a single grants manager pursue DDF grants for local and international projects. President-Elect Marty and Club Secretary Mike are working on next year's budget and hope to review a two-year budget with the board at future meetings. #### PROGRAM RECAP: MILLENNIALS AND THE REST OF US

Millennials are loosely defined as those born between the early 1980s and the early 2000s, children of Baby Boomers and early Gen-Xers. So they are now in their late teens to early thirties.

Speakers Jack Williamson and Emma Neuberger told Boulder Rotary Friday that the gulf between the young millennials and the old folks, like us, isn't as large as many people think.

Jack, a retired Air Force chaplain, felt writing might be a good platform for sharing life

issues between young and old. After seeing success with a program matching high schoolers with senior citizens, he decided to try a similar effort with millennials, aka CU students, and local residents over 50 years old. After the program was publicized, he ended up with 40 students and 40 volunteers from the community.

The students received credit for the class, where each of them was paired with one of the "elders." Jack said the results illustrated the power of breaking down silos between the generations, noting there is only "a thin" difference between them.

Emma, a CU junior, was one of those students. She said she and her partner mentored each other during their interactions. Each team completed three writing projects, starting with New Yorker magazine-style profiles of each other. Participants' ages ranged from 19 to 87.

Emma's teammate, Lou, also spoke, calling the class "a beautiful and very rich experience. I have learned as much from Emma as she may have learned from me."

Jack described millennials as "optimistic, amazing, competent people," eager to find new purpose, to develop an awareness of how to improve the world for those to come.

The intergenerational communication course is offered through CU's Program for Writing and Rhetoric.

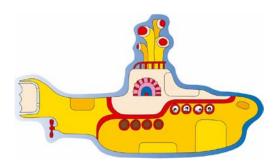

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#### PROPOSAL FROM BRCF BOARD

#### BRC – BRCF MOU

- 3. Decisions on the priorities and pattern of benevolent giving and disbursal of charitable funds shall be made through a collaborative decision-making process between the two governing boards with full communication with the club membership. Such decisions shall include but not be limited to: the balance between domestic and international program grantees; the magnitude of giving levels; the role and responsibilities of outside organizations in the programs; the fundraising techniques to be used (i.e. Signature Event, portions of dues used, garage sales, planned giving, sale of merchandise etc.); whether to have a permanent endowment; and, the structure of the grant program.
- 4. The Board of the Foundation, pursuant to its bylaws and under the requirements of the Internal Revenue Code, has ultimate authority for decision making relating to the use of Foundation funds.
- 5. Each Board will keep the other currently and fully informed about any grant to be made by either Board for charitable purposes in advance of the actual decisions with reasonable opportunity provided for a joint meeting of the Boards should either Board so request. However, Club committees will retain their authority to manage and direct their committee budgets.
- 6. Within reason, the two Boards shall decide what types and portions of charitable donations by members of the Club will be deposited with and disbursed by the Foundation and thereby qualify as deductions from the member's taxable income as provided in Federal and State law.

#### Current Proposal

1. \$8000 for Community School Summer Programs, from the Gamm Fund.

We propose allocating \$4000 each to the following programs:

The Family Learning Center, at 3164 34th St. This Center serves 65-70 students in all, which includes a range of pre-school, elementary, middle and high school, as well as an adult program. Our funds would be designated for their pre-school children for the summer enrichment 6-week program. The Director, Ramona Thomas, explained to me that they do not have the funds to support enough of these children in the summer.

New Horizons Cooperative PreSchool at 1825 Upland. They hold T-Th, and MWF classes throughout the school year, hosting 16 children in each class; they too have difficulty funding their summer program for these children. Director, Isolde Stewart.

These institutions work closely with the BVSD, are 503c not-for profit, each with their own Foundation.

2. With regard to the Education Endowment Fund, we recommend an allocation of \$5000 to the BVSD Summer Enrichment Program, which we have supported for each of the past 2 years. We

also recommend that the BRCF use \$7500 of EE available dollars to support the Rotary Residency Scholarship Program.

We recommend that the remaining \$5000 in proceeds continue to be invested in the Endowment, to be available as a "rainy day" fund in case there is a bad year for our investments in the near future.

#### **Proposal to Stream and Record BRC Meetings**

#### **Background:**

For the past several months we have been testing the use of **Zoom.us** videoconferencing platform to stream, record, and archive our meetings online.

Streaming online allows members (and others who are authorized to do so) to access and participate in regular Friday meetings. Zoom is also being used for committee meetings (eg, Membership Committee where remote attendees can videoconference in). Online access is available on all pcs (with camera/mic), tablets, smart phones. Audio only is also available using a simple phone call to special number. (note: streaming for remote participants has had only limited testing to date)

Recording allows a local recording to be made/stored on the host computer, as well as any *authorized* computer joining the session. This recording can then uploaded to an archive (e.g., YouTube) and be made available via a link. This link can be placed in a list of meetings/programs on our web site as well as placed in the RIB or shared in an email or text.

We can separate the recorded BRC business meeting from the speaker presentation and have access from separate links, if needed.

Speakers will be asked to sign a release (drafted by President Bill--attached) to allow use of their recorded presentation. On the rare occasion that a speaker does not want their presentation to be available generally, it can be password protected and/or be placed on BRC web site in our "members only" section.

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#### Proposal:

I propose we start regular <u>live streaming</u> of BRC Friday meetings, announcing this in weekly PP and RIB including a regular posting with the Zoom link, phone # and meeting ID.

President Bill could suggest a process to get speaker's signatures on the release and to store these documents. President Bill has also suggested we post a sign outside the meeting space clearly announcing that the meetings are being.

I also propose that we <u>record and archive</u> BRC Friday meetings (and possibly committee meetings) using a process decided by tech committee and approved President with input from the board and interested committee chairs. The new BRC web site should include a section to access the recorded videos.

#### **Resources required:**

We will need to <u>subscribe to a Zoom Pro Account at \$15/mo</u>. (In future, may need more than one account if wanting to have simultaneous meetings with remote attendees.)

Otherwise, for Friday meetings, I think we're in good shape with present camera, PC (generously donated by Mike B.) and connectors, cables, and adaptors that I have available.

However, use of Zoom to allow virtual attendance at committee meetings could be highly valuable--making such meetings considerably easier and more convenient to schedule and attend. For these, it might be desirable to get a \$200 conference camera/speakerphone such as <a href="Logitech Conference Cam BCC950">Logitech Conference Cam BCC950</a>—particularly for meetings having both an in-person group and virtual (remote) attendees.

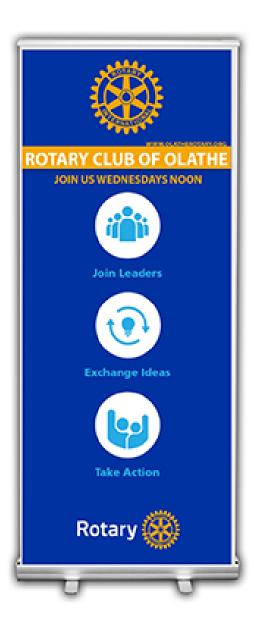
