A Chicago, attorney, he formed the Rotary Club of Chicago on 23 February 1905, so professionals with diverse backgrounds could exchange ideas, form meaningful, lifelong friendships, and give back to their communities.

Rotary members have not only been present for major events in history—we've also been part of them. Three key traits have remained strong through our history.

- 1. We're truly international. Only a few years after being founded there were clubs on six continents.
- We persevere through tough times. During World War II many clubs were forced to disband. After the war members came together to rebuild their countries and their clubs.
- We are committed to service and we dream big and set bold goals. We began our fight against polio in 1979 and now it exists in only three countries.
 Down from 125 in 1988.
