MATTRU HOSPITAL

Continuing an association that began nearly 40 years ago, our club has engaged in a project with Mattru Hospital in Sierra Leone, which was established by member and past president of our club, Dr. Dewitt Baker.

The project provides for the purchase of 61 smart meters which connect local homes and businesses to the newly installed solar grid. The meters work on a pre-paid basis using cards embedded with micro-chips so the hospital can avoid becoming a collection agency. Clients simply charge up their cards with kilowatt hours and insert their cards into their smart meters. The cost of the project is about \$10,000 and it has been fully subscribed.

The solar grid was installed in 2017 and replaces a diesel generator that previously provided electricity for the hospital. The generator had to be started up each time the operating room was needed for surgery.

The Mattru hospital is a referral hospital for the region, and the care given through maternity care and vaccinations and treatment for children under five have significantly reduced the high rate of maternal and infants deaths in the district.

Support and Strengthen Clubs

Achieve at least three of the following goals:
