This Week's program notes by Mike Rush

Carol Black presented a message that began with hate-inducing trauma which later became a message of love and support. She is a retired licensed audiologist, and she was present in the Tree Of Life Synagogue in Pittsburg the morning of October 27, 2018, when a shooter began murdering people who were praying at Saturday morning services. She heard what she soon determined to be automatic gun fire, and she saved her life by hiding in a dark closet. There were 22 people in the synagogue that morning, and half of them were murdered before the shooter was stopped by first responders . (The trial, after many delays, is scheduled to begin with jury selection on April 24.) After the event Carol soon went back to work as it was therapeutic for her to help other people with their hearing problems. Afterall, that

was her occupation. She also went back to services again as she felt her brother, Dr. Richard Gottfried, one of the victims of the shooting would have wanted her to do so. There were actually three congregations praying that day, and all three lost innocent people to the shooter. Carol acknowledged that she had survivor's guilt, and that she had difficulty sleeping for several months, always hearing gun shots. She found a trauma counselor who offered a great deal of help to Carol. As a result of the shooting some new organizations have arisen, 2 of which are the 10/27 Healing Partnership, and the Pittsburgh Families Bridging Kindness. The latter reaches out to other communities that are victims of hate and violence. Carol is involved in both of these organizations along with others. Carol was appreciative of the Pittsburgh Muslim community for raising half a million dollars to pay all funeral and burial expenses of the victims along with helping with transportation and housing expenses for travel of families of the victims. Carol reminded us that Jews constitute just 0.2% of the U.S. population, but they are victims of 55% of hate crimes. Anti Semitism is real, and it is up to each of us to speak out against injustice for all victims of hate and intolerance. A documentary that is available now on HBO is "*A Tree Of Life: The Pittsburgh Synagogue Shooting*." Another, *Repairing the World: Lessons from the Tree Of* Life has not yet been released.

We thank Carol for sharing her message of resilience and the hope for a better future for all of us. And we thank her family for their support of her efforts to share this tragedy with as many people as possible, so that one day this type of thing will end forever.
