Jody Dean is an Emmy award-winning veteran of television and radio and a member of the Texas Radio Hall of Fame. A Fort Worth native, Dean attended Abilene Christian University and is an active philanthropic leader, lending his talents to many local causes, particularly those that support veterans and the military, children and the homeless.

Dean is the former host of the morning show at 98.7 KLUV-FM and was on the air in North Texas longer than any other local broadcaster in recent history.

KEYNOTE SPEAKER

MICHAEL ELLIOTT

Michael L. Elliott is a native of Linden NC. He entered active duty in August 1987, attending Basic Training and Advanced Individual Training as an Airborne Infantryman. Mike has two combat tours in the Persian Gulf War.

Mike Elliott's past assignments include the 1st Battalion, 13th Infantry, Baumholder, Germany, Headquarters, and Headquarters Company, 101st Airborne Division, Fort Campbell, Kentucky; 82nd Airborne Division Company B, 2d Battalion, 504th Airborne Infantry, Fort Bragg, North Carolina; Company D and headquarters Company, 1st Battalion, 507 Airborne Infantry, Fort Benning, Georgia, Company C, 2d Battalion, 325th Parachute Infantry Regiment Fort Bragg, North Carolina and culminating his service to the nation with over ten consecutive years of service with the US Army Parachute Team, ("Golden Knights"), Fort Bragg, North Carolina.

Mike has completed more than 15,000 freefall parachute jumps 5,000 of which are tandem jumps. On three separate occasions, he has held the life of one of the most important men in the US in his hands, former President George H. W. Bush has completed three tandem skydives with Mike.

Mike has earned every instructional and technical rating available in the skydiving community, as well as an Associates Degree in Business Administration. Mike is also the President and Founder of The All Veteran Group with the mission to Honor, Remember and Serve and serves as an advisor for the Airpower Foundation! Mike also is the founder of Combat Injured Troops!

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THE USO

The Rotary Club of Dallas is involved in many activities in the local community and around the world. Below are a few of our annual projects:

Service Above Self Teacher Awards - This annual event provides an opportunity to recognize outstanding Dallas ISD teachers and to financially reward them for going the extra mile to make a lasting, positive impact on their students.

Bike Rodeo & Child Safety Day - In Partnership with Texas Scottish Rite Hospital, an annual bike safety course is developed for several hundred local children from age 3 to mid-teens where they can experience bicycle safety.

Dream Team Mentoring & Scholarship Program - Our Dream Team mentors work with bright students attending Woodrow Wilson High School to help them prepare for college and beyond. Students in the program are eligible for college scholarships from The Dallas Rotary Club Foundation.

Global Clean Water and Dental Initiative - Through Rotary grants, we provide clean drinking water and free dental clinics to people in Ghana through mission trips and additional ongoing support.

Rotary Club of Dallas Charity Golf Tournament - In 2015 an annual golf tournament and silent auction was established to raise funds for Safer Dallas Better Dallas. Safer Dallas supports the Dallas Police Department and its needs beyond what is funded by the city.

Feeding Children Everywhere - In 2013 our focus turned to primarily feeding the hungry in Dallas. Teams are formed to package dried food ingredients and, in the matter of two hours, more than 28,000 meals are packaged and later distributed to Dallas ISD school pantries.

Pints For Polio - Rotary International and its partners continue to address critical issues affecting health, wellbeing, and human rights locally and around the globe.
