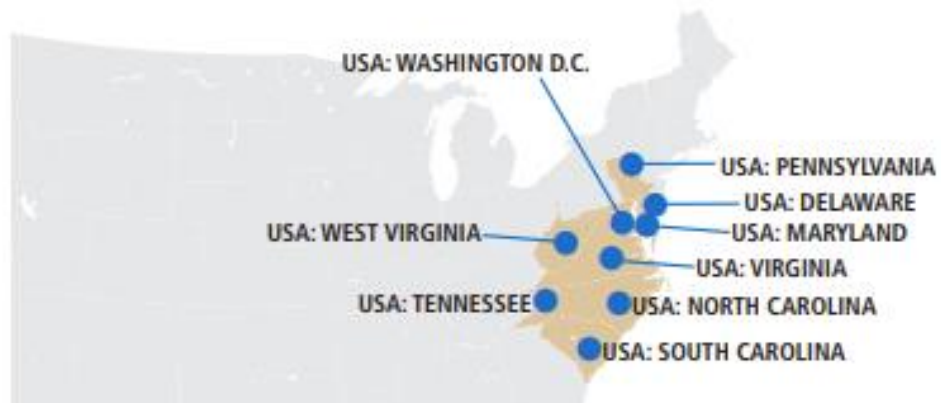

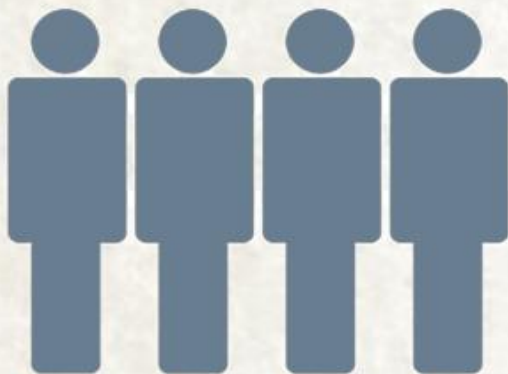

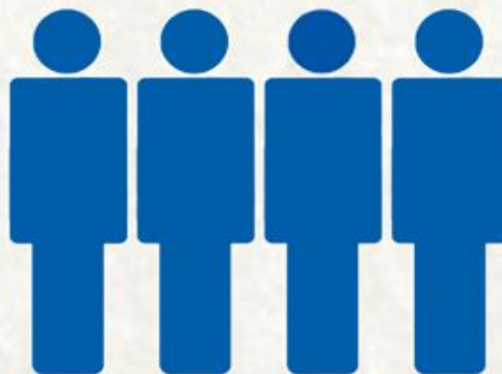

**First:** The development of acquaintance as an opportunity for service.

**Second:** High ethical standards in business and profession. The recognition of the worthiness of all useful occupations. The dignifying of each Rotarian’s occupation as an opportunity to serve society.

**Third:** The application of the ideal of service in one’s personal, business, and community life.

**Fourth:** The advancement of international understanding, goodwill, and peace through a world fellowship of business and professional persons united in the ideal of service.

# The Rotary International Foundation

The Rotary Foundation transforms your gifts into service projects that change lives both close to home and around the world.

Since it was founded more than 100 years ago, the Foundation has spent more than \$4 billion on life-changing, sustainable projects.



## Rotary Foundation Recognition Levels

Sustaining Member - \$100 a year

Paul Harris Fellow - \$1,000 total. Different level for each \$1,000 up to a total of \$10,000

Benefactor - \$1,000 to the Endowment fund in estate documents

Society Member - \$1,000 annually to the Foundation



## More Rotary Foundation Recognition Levels

Major Donor recognition is given when the lifetime combined total cash giving of an individual or couple reaches the following levels:

Level 1 = \$10,000

Level 2 = \$25,000

Level 3 = \$50,000

Level 4 = \$100,000

Arch C. Klumph Society Membership = \$250,000

Bequest Society Membership is granted when the Rotary Foundation is honored in the estate plans of an individual or couple at the following levels:

Level 1 = \$10,000

Level 4 = \$100,000

Level 2 = \$25,000

Level 5 = \$250,000

Level 3 = \$50,000

Level 6 = \$500,000

Level 7 = \$1,000,000
