Lenexa Rotary 4-Way Test Speech Scholarship

- Any high school student attending school in Johnson County may participate.
- The student will prepare a 5-7 minute speech on his/her topic of choice and will apply the Rotary 4-Way test for decision making to that topic.

The 4-Way Test

1. Is it the truth?
2. Is it fair to all concerned?
3. Will it build goodwill and better friendships?
4. Will it be beneficial to all concerned?

- Qualifying rounds will be held on the evenings of November 30th and December 1st, 2015 at Community Covenant Church, 15700 W. 87th Street, Lenexa, KS. Speeches for the three finalists will be given on Friday, December 4th, 2015 at the regular lunch meeting for the Lenexa Rotary Club at North Point in Lakeview Village, 14100 W. 90th Terrace, Lenexa, KS.
- Each speech will be judged by Rotarian members.
- Participant's name or school will not be announced prior to the contest.
- The following criteria will be used in judging:
 - 50% of score is earned by the student incorporating and directly applying the 4-Way test questions to the topic.
 - 25% of score is earned by how well the topic is developed.
 - 25% of score is earned by presentation style.
- Each participant is strongly encouraged to attend at least one of the help sessions to ask questions and review videos of past contestants. The following help sessions are planned at the office of:

- Scholarships will be awarded to the top three contestants:

1st Place - \$2,000
2nd Place - \$1,500
3rd Place - \$1,000

JUDGING CRITERIA

DIRECT APPLICATION OF 4-WAY TEST

1. IS IT THE TRUTH?
2. IS IT FAIR TO ALL CONCERNED?
3. WILL IT BUILD GOODWILL AND BETTER FRIENDSHIPS?
4. WILL IT BE BENEFICIAL TO ALL CONCERNED?

The contestant can choose any topic, but is required to incorporate the 4-Way test of Rotary to that topic.

Questions a judge should consider in scoring:

1. Did the contestant clearly incorporate the 4-Way test of Rotary to his/her topic?
2. Did the contestant develop each application completely enough to demonstrate that any conclusions came with much thought on his/her part?
3. Did the contestant use relevant examples, illustrations, facts, or figures to support their conclusions?

Maximum Score: 50%

TOPIC DEVELOPMENT

Questions a judge should consider in scoring:

1. Did the contestant put ideas together so that the audience could understand them?
2. Is the speech structured around a purpose with an opening, body, and conclusion?
3. Did the contestant immediately engage the audience's attention and then move forward toward a significant conclusion?
4. Does the entire speech present the audience with a unified whole thought?

Maximum Score: 25%

PRESENTATION STYLE

Questions a judge should consider in scoring:

1. Did the contestant's appearance reinforce the speech?
2. Did the body language used (gestures, expressions, and body positioning) support the points of the speech?
3. Did the contestant have a flexible voice, moving from one pitch level to another for emphasis?
4. A good voice should be clearly heard and the words easily understood. Did the contestant use a variety of rate and volume to present his/her topic?
5. Did the contestant speak with enthusiasm and assurance, showing interest in the audience and topic, and confidence in their reactions?
6. Did the contestant use appropriate language? Language should promote clear understanding of thoughts and should fit the occasion and topic.

Maximum Score: 25%
