

Earnest too urged us to support this event "in a big way." Then he called *Memorial Elementary* Principal Sarika Pride to the podium to announce the program.





Ms. Pride thanked us for *Send Me to the Symphony*, where all her 4th graders got bussed to the *Plano Symphony Orchestra*'s recent concert for young people. (The PSO coordinates with PISD music teachers to reinforce musical principles under instruction.) She also offered profuse thanks for our **CITIZEN OF THE TEAR BANGUET** for which the "students were selected for doing the right things." Then she introduced the *Memorial* music teacher, **Ms. Culp**, and 21 cute 4th and 5th graders who constitute the school's Musical Ensemble.

Ms. Culp noted that the group, which utilizes percussion instruments and so is more than a choir, had actually composed an *a capella* piece that would open their program today. The kidlets began a round of noises such as children might make with their mouths in idle moments, but which, taken together, constituted a catchy rhythm.

"Shhhhh, bump bump, AHHH! Chigga chigga BOOM, AHHH!" And so forth.



Ms. Culp added that the 25-minute class period was woefully short to be able to instill instrumental instruction so it consisted mostly of rhythm instruments. But she'd brought xylophones (unused) to indicate that melody too played a role.

But Ms. Culp is also the Band Director, so the second and last performance piece was a rousing rendition of the *Memorial* Anthem or, as she described it, the *Memorial* Bebop.

Ms. Culp too thanked us for our support.


