Tino Trujillo on August 12th. Tino swore he was only 79. It would be celebrated on the following (past, as you read this) Saturday from 5 to 7 (presumably at Tino's). Someone inquired whether or not it was a surprise party.

As **Patti** had deigned to appear, **LENNY** presented her with her 14-year (Perfect[‡]) Attendance pin in a manner reserved only for her, his "favorite Rotarian."





Then, prefaced by praise for all the good Rotarians do for the community outside Rotary, he announced that the most recent Athena Award was going to Camille Ussery! The official award ceremony would be held on September 21st in conjunction with the **Best** of Plano event, sponsored by Mary Jo Dean's hospital. That's only appropriate because Mary Jo was also an Athena awardee along with

Maribelle Davis, Carole Greisdorf, Marty McGee, Jo Via, and Alice Hobbs. Plano Rotary seems to have been blessed with powerful women despite the Men's Club holdouts.



David McWhorter again introduced the day's speaker, Blank, in Chuck Kathy Morgan's absence. Kathy is Development Director (read CASA "barker") for (Court-Appointed Special Advocates) of *Collin County*. Her introduction read as follows:

In the wake of the Penn State Child Abuse scandal, the public is beginning to realize our collective responsibility to

protect our children and speak up against child abuse. However, most everyday citizens don't know what each of us can do to protect our children. At *CASA of Collin County*, hundreds of well-trained community volunteers have been providing a powerful voice for over 7,000 children from Collin County in foster care over the past 21 years. *CASA* volunteers know that one voice truly makes a difference. Join us and you can make a difference too! (Someone has written her own intro?) Kathy Blank has been Development Director at *CASA* of *Collin County* since 2009, and she has worked in agencies protecting vulnerable children for the past nine years. However, she has been an advocate for children throughout her entire career, working as a Pediatric Occupational Therapist before transitioning into the nonprofit community after moving to North Texas in 1996.

Kathy's focus at CASA is to build long-lasting relationships in the community that help others share resources and partnerships to support vulnerable children. Besides her work at CASA of Collin County, Kathy has served on the board of Leadership Plano, Plano Chamber of Commerce, Plano Chamber Women's Division and is active at Custer Road United Methodist Church. Kathy's family includes two adult sons, two teenage daughters, and two adorable grandsons!

Commenting that David had been "too generous" with "his" introduction, she chastened **Kelly Palmer** to "behave today." She also mentioned that CASA's Executive Director, Susan Etheridge, had spoken to Rotary about a year ago.



Prior to her talk, she had done her research on *Plano Rotary*, marveling at its 67 years of *"helping the community,"* and in particular its children. She mentioned our Hallowe'en Carnival, the many contributions to the *Plano Children's Medical Clinic*, the youth scholarships we've mounted, and our recent capture of the Executive Director of the *Children's Advocacy Center*, Lynn McLean.



Then we got the pitch: Texas leads the nation in deaths due to child abuse. (We're also first in deaths due to incarceration.) She said that the frequency of child abuse is three per <u>hour</u> in this State. Collin County is in "Region 3" as these statistics go, and that region has the distinction of having the highest child abuse in Texas. (If child abuse were an Olympic event, we'd

have won Gold.) Some 7,000 children have been removed from Collin County homes. The *Advocacy Center* investigates the circumstances and testifies at the resultant criminal trials, but *CASA* then not only gives voice to the voiceless but also stays with the child through (sometimes) years to find it a safe home. Indeed, although the child may "*encounter many different changes*" involving foster care, schools, etc., the *CASA* advocate stays with them, a constant throughout the process.

By way of example, Kathy showed us a video of two children, **Ryan** and **Jonathan**, who suffered as a teen and toddler, respectively. Jonathan was hospitalized and left disabled. He was placed with his special needs sister in a home, but proved to be too active for the foster parents. So he was placed with his aunt and three other families within two years. **Deborah**, his advocate, finally found him the foster home he needed.

We learned that during the last decade, the child population increased 85%, but child abuse increased almost 200%. Kathy knew she was "*preaching to the choir*" here, but she suggested ways for us to help.

1. "Like" CASA on Facebook

- 2. Shop at *Willowbend* on the tax-free weekend and send the receipts to CASA which will win \$2,500 if they garner the most
- 3. Volunteer to become an advocate.

Advocates commit to a year of service amounting to about 15 hours per month. During that year, there may be 4-5 court appearances. 45% of advocates work, and they are predominantly women, so CASA needs male volunteers including African Americans and bilingual ones. They receive training some four times per year.



CASA has partnered with Willowbend and Texas Health, but it could use more. So Kathy wants us to "talk up ways to get involved." She reminded us although that. Rotary is our best organization, we also can get involved with others. She

mentioned CASA's own golf tournament and said that 25% of funds come from that plus its Annual Gala.

Since the audience had no questions, she tossed out that 30% of cases come from Plano. (Since we have 34% of the population of the county, that's not surprising.) Then she thanked us for the invitation to speak and told us, "We make a difference for children in the foster care system."

LENNY presented her with her dog tags from ONCE IN A LIFETIME and mentioned that there was space for two more advertisers on the back page. (He miscounted; we have room for seven more advertisers!) Ken Roberts moved for adjournment, so Lenny led us in the Four-Way Test and abolished the assembly at 12:55.
