David McWhorter introduced Shirley Hu, a Paul Harris Fellow from Metro Rotary:

Shirley Hu is the marketing director of the Epoch Times, a grassroots publication of the Chinese people that tells unvarnished truth about what's really going on in



China. It's published in 15 countries and in 19 different languages. Shirley earned her Bachelor's degree in Economics from Tulsa University, a Master's degree in Guidance & Counseling from Tulsa, and another Master's in Computer Science from the New Jersey Institute of Technology.

In her Information Technology career, Shirley has worked for Dow Jones, Bell Labs, Johnson & Johnson, and Alcatel-Lucent as an applications developer and project manager. Recently, Shirley has been devoting her time to various volunteer activities. She teaches Chinese in Chinese school. She serves on the alumni board of Taipei, the First Girl's High School, and the board of her college alumni association. She provides community



services for Rotary clubs, and the Dallas Arts District. She offers monthly meetina registration support for the Project Management Institute. She tracks finances for the Global Federation of Chinese Business Women. when she's not doing all that, she serves as an

events coordinator for the Shen Yun Performing Arts of DFW to promote moral values.

Shirley demonstrated the traditional moral values of the Chinese people:

Buddhism = compassion Taoism = truthfulness

Confucianism = humanity and all for righteousness, propriety, wisdom, and faithfulness.

While Chinese tradition worships the divine, the Communist takeover in 1948 worships "materialism and atheism" and uses "violence to stop its opposition." The C ultural

Revolution (1966-76) threw out "old customs, old culture, old habits, old ideas," reeducating the intelligentsia, and shutting down higher education for a decade! While it is widely admitted to have been in error, even in China, the tanks in T iananmen S quare (1989) confirmed an official intolerance of counter-revolutionary protest. Moreover the 2008 earthquake followed by tainted milk disasters and the recent high-speed train crash indicate that official corruption, fostered since the economic boom, plague the nation. Sixteen thousand officials have "stashed \$125B overseas" and fled the country.



Into this "cultural abyss," S hen

attempts to crystallize through art a desire to return to traditional values of a dynastic past. Six million audience members have witnessed the 20 episode show with a live orchestra.

Shirley showed a video of egregious praise for the performance from New York luminaries. And the dynastic review is coming to the Winspear on January 2-3 and the Bass on February 20.
