Coach Hughes claimed he loved the new 2-a-day prohibitions (against practices in the Texas heat). They manage by scheduling a 10-minute break in between the two onehour practices in a single session. Brence had mentioned that they must come inside after only a single hour if the temperature tops 100°F.

Mike mentioned that he'd hired Coach **Joey McCullough**, brother of Jaydon, at one time during his 12-years of coaching. **Randy** asked if that made him 84 years old. Ignoring the jibe, Mike touted the virtues of Principal **Kathy King** as "*she supports everything we do.*"

He decried the necessity of

staff changes at *Plano West*, turncoat Joey having taken two coaches with him to *Plano East*. Still his mantra is "*Coach Fast. Keep Moving. Get in as many reps as you can.*" And, he claimed, though academics are the *raison*



d'être, "football teaches you things you don't learn in the classroom." It "reinforces parents," and "holds 'em (kids) accountable." Suffice it to say, he's "excited about the team."

He said his greatest moment in coaching was when he walked out onto the practice field with his son. And he promised the *Wolves* would "*play hard, represent* Plano West (well), *and make you proud.*"



Plano Senior High Wildcats coach, Jaydon McCullough, was up next. He explained that he'd sought guidance for his talk from Gerald. "Talk about anything you want," Coach Brence had

told him, "Just keep it short." Well, Jaydon wanted to know, should he talk about the schedule or statistics? "Anything," Gerald repeated, "but keep it short." Jaydon asked, "Can I talk about you?" The response was, "Take all the time you need."

Jaydon said he'd started as a Schimelpfenig Middle School coach before moving finally to his dream job at Plano Senior High. He's two State Championships under his belt for which he thanks Athletic Director Brence and Principal **Sarah Watkins**. He says "She understands, it's all about the kids."



He says he's proudest of "being a teacher," and following in the footsteps

of Mike Hughes, "*a tremendous teacher*." He also thanked younger brother Joey for paying attention to what he was supposed to do and "*not what I <u>wasn't</u> supposed to do*." He related a tale of catching Joey smoking and forbidding him to hang around with the wrong crowd. The lesson took, and Jaydon's proud to witness Joey's career paralleling his own.

When asked, "Why do you teach?" he replies, "Because it's my purpose in Life. God wants me to do this." Although he doesn't mind winning, he just wants the kids to "play to the best of their abilities."

He asked us, "*Are you a spectator or a fan*?" The difference is "*Are you cheering? Are you positive*?" He loves watching the fans, and the cheerleaders apparently aren't hard on the eyes either. And he loves to "*see a kid happy after doing something great*!"

There are things he doesn't like:

1. Losing

2. When a player doesn't get to play, and

3. The hours away from the family.

He quoted again the player's prayer, which included, "Mom and Dad please don't yell at me. I need to pay attention to the game."

And he related again his star player's comment, "I never get tired of being complimented. I like it when you correct me. I like it when you listen."

Brother Joey, *Plano East* **Pauthers** Coach, told us what an honor it was to be here today. In his coaching, "*Passion is what you look for.*" And he teaches that if you "*Give love, you get love.*"





He still recalls vividly being suited up by Mom for the Rice playing field just behind the Harvey Hotel. It was there he developed his passion, his dream, and his purpose. He is as grateful to parents who showed him how to work as he is to brothers who showed him how not to smoke. And he wouldn't "be standing her today" without Coach Hughes, who told him, "I'm #1. You're #2." Mike is "one of the best offensive line coaches I've seen. He may be harsh, but you know what you'll get with him every day!"



He taught Joey to be like the sun, to come up every day. Get up. Make your bed. It's "the little things that matter. Tell your parents that you love them. Perception is realitų."

PESH had 320 show up this summer and he chose 95 of them for football camp. He wants them to "have a dream...to know where we're goin'." To bring PESH back, they must "play for four quarters...run the football."

With a voice clearly strained, he urged us all to see PESH play at the Boneyard Aug. 29.


