

She began by debunking the useless advice you're likely to get from friends and family.

- Don't believe résumés or job descriptions.
- 2. What got you here won't get you there.
- 3. Job boards are a waste of time.
- 4. "Perfect résumés" won't get you a job.
- 5. Friends don't know the rules.
- 6. The "right kind of energies in the right places" will get you noticed and move your careers.

Also US companies no longer require US workers; they can easily outsource to India and Eastern Europe. Your leaving your job at 5 pm, but it's 3:30 am in Mumbai, and your replacement is just getting to work completing



a 24/7 workday. Working with the same *Lexis/Nexis* that you employ, Lakshmi continues your research on that legal brief.

The New Normal for professionals is that 40 now do the work once assigned to 80. Titles have been downgraded. Your interviewer now needs the answer to only three questions:

- 1. Can you do the job?
- 2. Do you want the job?
- 3. Do *I* want to work with you?

To stand out, you must possess "an uncanny ability to read subtext." (That is, are you supernatural at understanding what you're not being told? Wink wink. Nudge nudge.)

Building relationships has always been important. Now it's crucial. (*It's not what you know but who you know*, in the common parlance.) It's all a matter of who the boss trusts.

You need to

- Read what they're reading.
- Know your industry.
- Be a "self-improvement sponge."
- Be eager to transfer to Poughkeepsie.
- Be on LinkedIn (ignore privacy concerns)
- Be a self-starter.
- Take responsibility.
- Cultivate well-spent time, money, and reputation.
- Understand managers are risk averse.


