**KIFK** then introduced **Lt. General Rick Lynch**, U.S. Army, retired, and author of "*Adapt or Die*," 196,667<sup>th</sup> rank in Amazon.

Rick Lynch...is the Executive Director of the *University of Texas at Arlington* Research Institute (UTARI). He is a graduate of the *U.S. Military Academy at West Point*, New York. He earned his master's degree in Mechanical Engineering with a concentration in Robotics from *Massachusetts Institute of Technology*. He

served in the United States Army for 35 years. His commands included the Third Infantry Division in combat and III Corps and Fort Hood. In his last position in the Army, Lt. Gen. Lynch managed all 163 Army installations around the world, a workforce of 120,000 people and an annual budget of nearly \$13 billion.

Under the direction of Lynch, UTARI is focusing on short-term communication of research particularly in the area of Assistive Technologies. With the UTARI team and collaborators, specific industries and areas of research are being targeted. They include Advanced Manufacturing, Applied Robotics, and Medical Technologies.

Lt. Gen. Lynch has been married to his beautiful wife, **Sarah**, for over thirty years. They have two adult children, **Susan** and **Lucas**, and one grandson, **JW**. They also enjoy time with their two Labrador Retrievers, **Maggie** and **Bailey**.



Gen. Lynch said that he approached his high school counselor, **Eileen Lowell**, with a desire to go to college but no means to do so. She told him that he didn't need funds to go to military academies; indeed, they'd pay <u>him</u> to go. *West Point's* acceptance came the day before that from *Annapolis*, so he missed becoming a sailor by 24 hours.

He told tales out of school about his Dad, "drafted in 1945 and the worst

*soldier*" imaginable. He even promoted himself from private to Lt. Gen. after being discharged.

He was a bit kinder to his wife, who was in the audience keeping him honest. She was Director of Parks & Rec when he sought to register a softball team. "She buzzed me incessantly until I took her out" (presumably on a date, since she was still extant). Her Dad was a Sergeant in the Army and had left her with the advice, "Don't marry a GI!" So, though "it took \$690 in flowers, it was worth it" to marry her. Now he takes her everywhere with him, because, during his Army career, he was apart from her for 13 years.

He sees the impact of 12 years of war in the Middle East "in the eyes of the servicemen" (and women). Multiple deployments have led to increased suicides as soldiers tell him "my four-year-old son calls me by my first name," so unfamiliar are they to their families. So he thanks not only those in his command for their service but also their families for their sacrifice. That's why he so enjoys presenting to Rotary, because we "place service above self."

With the statement, "In the Army, it ain't the generals; it's the sergeants," he introduced his Chief Operations Officer, Sgt. **Don Phelps**, U.S. Army, ret'd.



He said he wanted to leave us with two thoughts. The first was of UTARI to which he did not retire from the military so much as "transition." He invited us to visit and had provided a brochure on the venue to our ta-

The second thought was for Wounded Warriors. When asked by family members of the fallen whether or not they had died in vain. he would have denied it while still in command, but now that the U.S. has all but abandoned Iraq and Afghanistan, they have become safe havens for Al Qaeda. So he cannot now deny it in good faith.

The U.S. "walked away prematurely," and he still prays for the fallen. He claims there are those who have already forgotten 911 and don't understand that "we fought them" in the Middle East "so that we wouldn't have to fight them in Plano."

He works with the Gary Sinise Foundation building mortgage-free homes for paraplegic veterans in a project called Finally Home. But, "as a nation we are walking away from veterans."

He mentioned his book built upon "nine leadership principles," the most important of which are Faith and Family. He begins each day with a thought to Joshua 1:9, "...for the Lord God will be with you wherever you go."

Change requires Adaptive Leadership.

One must inculcate an attitude that sees opportunities rather than obstacles. When he commanded 25,000 troops in Southern Iraq, his budget was cut from \$20B the first year to \$15B the second, forcing him to focus on efficiencies of operations.

His wife's motto is "People don't care what you know until they know that you care." So he recommends that you "Love your subordinates like your children."

He was "stopped in the street" by a subordinates wife who said "You say you send our husbands home, but you're just teasing us." Thereafter he issued orders that nobody works on the weekends without his express approval, and no one sought it.

He took his Dad to visit his Mom's grave, and noted the tombstones upon which were engraved start dates and end dates separated by a dash. He exhorted us to "Live your dash."

KIRK claimed that HE wasn't "going to pick on him" as he was a year younger, but instead ## praised Lt. Gen. Lynch as one who "walks the talk." And ## cited the book as "a great read" to be found on Amazon when the supply he'd brought with him ran out.

Then **HE** presented Lt. Gen. Lynch with the "coveted Plano Rotary Clock," and led us in the Four-Way Test, releasing us on an unsuspecting world at 1:03.
