management experience in government relations, public policy, advocacy and public affairs. He holds a **Master's in Public Administration** from **UT** *Arlington* with graduate certificates in: 1) **Urban Nonprofit Management** 2) **Public Budgeting & Financial Management**.



TEAM RUBICON REQUIRES INDIVIDUALS FOOLISH ENOUGH TO THINK THEY CAN CHANGE THE WORLD, AND SMART ENOUGH TO HAVE A CHANCE.

TEAM RUBICON was established to help returning veterans. When a person is in the military, their goals are to protect their unit, their location, and freedom. When they return home after several years: their friends are gone, they don't have a lot in common with their parents, and many have lost their sense of purpose. According to the VA, there are an average of 21 suicides every day. Of those, 17 are veterans, and 4 are active-duty service members, guardsmen and reservists. That amounts to 6,100+ veterans and 1,350+ service members who die by suicide each year. Team Rubicon (TR) gives them a new purpose. It utilizes the skills and experiences of military veterans to rapidly deploy emergency response teams. Through this continuing service, TR provides our veterans with three things they lose after leaving the military: a purpose, gained through disaster relief; community, built by serving with others; and identity, from recognizing the impact one individual can make. Coupled with leadership development, training, and other opportunities, TR helps veterans transition from military to civilian life.

Founded in 2010, TR has deployed across the United States and around the world to provide immediate relief to those impacted by disasters and humanitarian crises. There are 250 regular members and a roster of over 65,000 volunteers. Los Angeles is the national headquarters while Grand Prairie is the regional logistics hub. *Southwest and American Airlines* provide subsidized flights.



TR provides the following capabilities and services to affected communities

- 1) Incident Management
- 2) Damage Assessments
- 3) Disaster Mapping and work order Management
- 4) Debris Management
- 5) Hazard Mitigation
- 6) Quick Home Repair
- 7) Management of Spontaneous Volunteers
- 8) Emergency Medicine (international) 9) Primary Care (international).

HERE ARE 3 PERSONAL STORIES FROM THE FIELD:

1) REPAIRING VETERAN'S HOMES IN PUERTO RICO

Over Veteran's Day weekend 2018, TR honored five Puerto Rican veterans by repairing their homes that were damaged by Hurricane Maria last year. Thirty TR grey shirt volunteers and one volunteer from the Veterans Administration worked on five homes in *Juncos Arecibo*.

Roofs were pressure washed and repaired, ceilings were repaired, and door frames fixed. The volunteers also painted.

TR Puerto Rico program manager **Hilda Vlachopoulou** said "The volunteers loved the experience of giving and honoring veterans with service. It was very rewarding."

Homeowners Felipe Gonzalez and his wife said many blessings over the volunteers. Mrs. Gonzalez said her doors will always be open for TR. She invited Hilda and the team to, "Always stop by and see her," and thanked them for their amazing work. She loved seeing TR's "Respect for Veterans" and the grey shirts "HARD WORK, DISCIPLINE AND DEDICATION UNDER THE BURNING SUN."

2) HONDURAS

Brittany Jagfeld I joined **TR** about two weeks before the Honduras leg of OPERATION CONTINUING PROMISE. I wasn't sure what to expect, but when I started working at the dental clinic, one thing stood out: the people of Honduras are very gracious and giving and I'm proud to serve them. On the third day, a woman came in for a dental cleaning. During the cleaning, she found out I was a volunteer and she was visibly happy and thankful I had volunteered my time. When I started to get up, she gave me a hug and a kiss on the cheek. She had tears in her eyes as she said, "You're my angel. God bless you." I was honored to provide her that service, along with the many others that came through the clinic, all showing their thanks by offering us gifts. I was a truck driver in the Wisconsin ARMY NATIONAL GUARD from 2005 - 2017, and I'm happy to participate in this operation and look forward to participating in more.

Thanks to TR, I can not only continue serving my own country, but I'm able to serve others as well.

3) IMPROVING A VETERAN'S QUALITY OF LIFE

Surrounded by million dollar homes with yachts, TR volunteers met with a 72-year-old veteran battling cancer named Raymond Cooper who needed help with his home. This veteran lived in a small, 40-year-old trailer, one of a handful on Yacht Road surrounded by million dollar homes. It had a leaking roof due to Hurricane Florence. A tarp couldn't be used, so a sealant had to be purchased and applied, but he didn't have the money. TR purchased roof sealant and other supplies at the local Home Depot.

The next day, **A-TEAM** style, they rolled up to **Ray's** home. A refrigerator was donated because the old one was moldy and a new couch also, because his was all wet. One of our **TR** members who serves as a **firefighter in Utah** applied the roof sealant with a broom for close to 2 hours with a smile on her face. This was her first operation with **TR**. Other volunteers helped to swap the old couch and fridge with the new ones. **TR** volunteers who were veterans also made phone calls to connect **Ray** to the **VA** and other local veteran service organizations. Everyone teamed up to help improve **Ray's** quality of life. It was a great day!
