David McWhorter rose to read the résumé of speaker David Torrance.

He is the CEO of *Renaissance Executive Forums* (REF). His passion is to help business owners, CEOs, and other top executives find strength and direction in numbers. David has practical experience of 30+ years' work in the U.S., Asia, India, South and Central America, the U.K. and Canada (only slightly redundant).

David holds a B.S. in Chemical Engineering (all is forgiven) from the *University of Texas* and an MBA in Global Management from the (phantom) *University of Phoenix*.

When not at work, David is committed to supporting local horse rescue programs for abused or neglected horses that are rehabilitated and adopted by good homes. David is an accomplished chef and feels there is nothing like a good meal to build and deepen relationships. (We could all relate to <u>that</u> today!) David served a Thai feast to more than 160 people—the one complaint was from the Minister at the Church—not a Thai food fan.

David first asked how many of us own smart phones. He had a sea of hands, not surprisingly. (We may be geriatric, but we're not stupid.)



He wanted to play "You Know You're a Redneck If..." with "Millennial" replacing "Redneck." So he asked how many of us own flip phones, which IDed us as "Baby Boomer" (or an even earlier vintage). He even offered a prize to the last one standing through a series of questions. "How many of you have taken a selfie?" "At Rotary?" "And posted it on Instagram?" Only Yoram had to admit to the last, and so he won a management self-help book written not by David but by a friend of his. So we were spared the sales pitch. They will slander your name "*all over* Facebook, *uh*, **Instagram**," he corrected himself, moving with the times. Only 30% of the Millennials consider themselves well-paid. And they were the 1st to be riffed in 2008 by the Boomers who did the firing. Not trusting.

25% conservative, 25% liberal, but 50% independent, they make the largest voting block, and they vote Democrat (ptui! ptui!).

50% approve of inter-racial marriage. 50% don't believe in God but "*don't care if you do.*"

David believes we Boomers need help in working with (over) Millennials. (In high tech, we might be working <u>for</u> them!)

ACT WITH INTEGRITY. "Trust is like an emotional bank account; you must make deposits before you make withdrawals."

CHARACTER. "Do what you say, whether you feel like it or not."

PASSION & PURPOSE. "Give them a purpose via roles and responsibilities."

CHALLENGE & DRIVE. "You must mentor them and give them their stories. They'll probably buy you a smart phone for it, John. They must know (the organization's) core values."

EMBRACE AUTONOMY. Accept flex hours and home officing. *"We've been doin' it since the '80s."*

ESTABLISH ACCOUNTABILITY. "...via coaching not punishment."
