

And finally, David, thank you for working with me this year as President-Elect. Your strength and unwavering devotion to the Club has set a high standard for which I hope to meet. You have been through a lot this past year, and you devotion has never wavered. Thank you, David!

And to the Plano Club, thank you again for honoring me to be your President. I count each of you as friends, and I hope that during the upcoming year, we can only strengthen that friendship.
