Cooper, and Jan Sullivan (her second).





For **HIS** first program, **KIFIK** augmented our own Past District Governors with a PDG from the first wave of women DGs, Janet Holland. ## called her, Brad Keith, Herb Hoxie, and LB THE RADIANT to the podium, threatening to introduce all but the latter. Janet joined Rotary in Mineral Wells in 1988. A mere 7 years later, she was District Governor.

Herb was a pilot in WWII stationed, among other Pacific Theater locations, at Iwo Jima. He joined the FBI, retired as Asst. Dir. at their Washington headquarters. He joined Rotary in 1963, becoming a member of four other clubs before joining us in 1991, becoming DG in 1996.

Born in Nebraska and raised in Oklahoma. Brad received his EdD from U Northern Colorado and became Governor of District 7280 in 1980.

LB joined Rotary in 1972, held most offices in Plano Rotary and became DG in 2008. Be been married to Donna for 49 years next month. They've 6 progeny counting the grandchildren for a total family of 14.

KIRK asked his panel, "Why did you join Rotary? What did you expect?"

Janet was warned on joining, "When you become President, you must go to PETS!" Many previous Presidents hadn't. She had Rotary in the blood; her Father was a member.

Herb said he joined out of the FBI, and, since he moved around, was a member of clubs in many states.

When Brad was Dean of Recreation, he was invited to a "What is Rotary?" speech, "and never looked back." He's been in perfect attendance since 1971.

LB joined because there were no CPAs in Plano Rotary, and anything going on in Plano "came from this Club."

The next request was for their "most memorable story as a Rotarian."

Janet went to Bangladesh as PDG in 1997 to build a Physical Therapy clinic. The eyes of those helped still haunt her.

Herb Hoxie was impressed with the district's build of a school house in Puerto Vallarta. He's made up in 33 countries, including Russia where he installed the Ivanovo Rotary.

Brad was moved by the resettlement of South Vietnamese after the war. His Rotary took a doctor's family under its wing, and they've become great contributors to the city.

We was moved literally to tears by 5810's response to his \$100K Challenge. 45 clubs put forth proposals and carried them out even though only the Addiction Center won.

KIFK gave them all Rotary clocks (courtesy of Alan Feigenbaum), thanked them (to a standing ovation), led us in the Four-Way Test, and ushered us out at 1:01.
