School Board, but she а classification has of Community Volunteer. Brad emphasized the "Flagship Club" aspect of the induction speech for the benefit of 5810 rep Bill Perryman. And when he finished. Skip pinned Nancy.





LO THE RADIANT introduced 5810's Foundation Chairman, Bill Perryman. Bill's been with the East Dallas Rotary since 1988 while holding down the Perryman Financial Group as a CPA (LD cheers). East Dallas has an average of \$1,300 per member invested in the Foundation. Bill's financial

management has won awards for excellence in 2002, 2004, 2006, 2008, and 2010; so LB recommends not using him in odd years. He noted that 5810 leads its zone in all-time giving to the Foundation in every category.



Bill thanked LB and posited that we might not be joking when we refer to Plano Rotary as the Flagship of the District. (Astute fellow.) He spoke of the very first speech he was asked to give (on the tax advantages of being an accountant). He researched Public Speaking and practiced his talk before delivering it, but when the time came to deliver, he chickened out and read the thing.

The woman, who invited him, critiqued the "speech," telling him there were only three things wrong with it.

- 1. You read it.
- 2. You read it poorly.
- 3. It wasn't worth reading.

He wanted to thank us for what we've already done on behalf of the Foundation. It's been a good year for 5810. We've raised our donations to the Foundation 400%. That's counting the \$1,009,000 in bequests received in one night at the benefit dinner.

Our Club stats are equally impressive.

- 235 Paul Harris Fellows
- 55 Multiple PHF
- 17 Estate Benefactors
- 7 Paul Harris Society Members
- \$423,263 in total donation

The Foundation is the most successful charity in the World. 100% of its donations are utilized. The funds reside in an investment account that pays the entire overhead for the fund. After 3 years, 50% of them come back to the District and the other half goes to the World Fund where the interest funds



multiple projects. The Permanent Fund has \$200 million with another \$400 million pledged.

Bill wanted us to know that **LB** recently won the Rotary Distinguished Service Award that can come only after winning the Citation for Meritorious Service for four years running. We all applauded **LB**'s accomplishment.

The Foundation was begun with \$26.50 in 1917, and made its first donation (of \$500 to Easter Seals) in 1930. Rotarian **Benny Santos** of the Philippines conceived of first Polio grant that became Polio Plus as **Albert Sabin** estimated it would take \$100 million to eradicate the disease worldwide. Rotary raised \$240 million in the first two years. The Americas became polio-free in 1994. Europe in 2002. In 2009, there were 1,604 cases worldwide. This year, with the advent of the bivalent vaccine in January, there have only been 71 cases in the PAIN countries: Pakistan, Afghanistan, India, and Nigeria. But an outbreak of 413 cases in Tajikistan from a source in Pakistan showed the world remains vulnerable as long as polio persists anywhere.

The Gates Foundation made a matching grant of \$100 million in 2007 and raised it by \$255 million last year. Rotary has raised \$137 million in response so far. Gates has estimated that Rotary has prevented 5 million polio cases

and prevented million deaths.

Other preventable deaths still plague Humanity. But, moving from death to disability, Bill spoke of the Wheelchair Foundation and the trip he took to Puerto Vallarta for a



distribution. He convinced us that \$37.50 is a small price to pay for a patient's mobility. Then he glanced out across the room and surmised that he shouldn't be asking for nickels and dimes from such a flush audience. He posited that none of us would miss a \$10,000 check nor would our estates miss such an amount were we to pledge that in our wills.

He pointed to the packets on the tables where we found forms to pledge \$84 a month (\$1,000 per year) to the Foundation. Among other projects, it will go to support microloans to women in the Third World, or water in

India, or trees in Jamaica, or to the disabled in Calcutta. The Foundation has tremendous potential because only 25% of Rotarians contribute to it. Bill confessed that in the first 14 vears of his Rotarian Life, he made no contribution!

He concluded with the Wisdom of Jiminv Cricket, to wit, "If you don't have a dream, how can you make a dream come true?"
