Octavio welcomed back **Kent Stone**, our ADG from *Richardson Central*, who vows to attend all our meetings and events. He also recognized Governor Forster and *Sunrise* Rotarian **David Craig**.

In an effort to boost back

page ad sales, **LENNY** announced that we would be resuming Classification Talks, beginning with back page advertisers. And the first victim was **Ray Huffines**. Ray told us he now had eight dealerships from Plano to

would have presented one to **Chris Henry**, but Chris was AWOL.) Gary asked all multiple Paul Harris Fellows to rise followed by all Paul Harris Fellows and Sustainers. Nearly the entire Club arose. (What won't we do to impress a District Governor?) The congregation applauded Kenny's contribution.

Randy Wright and **Alan Feigenbaum** tag-teamed us with information about the *Hendrick Golf Tournament* to be held August 20-21. Alan told us that we need golfers and sponsors still. Randy said that he'd be gone on vacation and we'd not hear



from him in over a month. To the round of applause he responded that he knew we'd appreciate that. On our tables, he had placed volunteer opportunity flyers, and he expected us all to come away with at least 3 points worth of efforts on the Tournament's behalf. We were to fill out and leave our preferred assignments with **Lynette**.

Scary Bol Epstein announced his intent to raise \$1 million for Wounded Warriors in 2012-13. He offered a flyer advertizing George Washington and the Battle of Long Island as a Rotary Program. This is done on behalf of the Association of the U.S. Army.

Ean arose to introduce Gov. Sandy, saying that she'd been everything in Rotary so far. She is a winner of the *Service Above Self Award*, only 150 of which are given out annually among the 1.2 million Rotarians. Apparently 5810 plays *"Where in the World is*



Sandy (Sandiego)?" And recent answers to that question have involved water wells in Zambia. Ean considers Sandy his "*Rotary wife*." **Jan** considers Ean on meds.

Ean told us a **Weight Loss Contest** between himself, Sandy, and Bill Dendy to slim <u>us</u>. We choose one, then we owe the Foundation \$1 for every pound <u>they</u> lose (and that could impoverish us)!

Sandy's first job was to explain that we were to vote

she asked, "*Are you ready for a change*?" rhetorically, Ean piped up, "**YES**!!" Sandy said that his enthusiasm could be misinterpreted (as a palace coup), but she'd give him the benefit of the doubt.

She told us, "*Rotary wants to change.*" And it is doing so by listening to people "*who don't know Rotary.*" Their opinions of the organization parallel those of **Sinclair Lewis** (*Babbitt*), who painted Rotarians with broad strokes, saying at one point, "*A Boy Scout is a young Rotarian; a Rotarian is a Boy Scout in long pants.*" To **H.L. Mencken**, they were part of the "*booboisie.*" (Bourgeois nincompoops)

The Rotary Innocent look upon it as a meeting place for "*rigid, stodgy, fossilized, outdated good-ole-boys.*" The *Genatric Club of Plane* resembles those remarks! Sandy insisted that Rotary is instead "*vibrant, dynamic*" and ready "to make a difference in someone's life."

She wants Rotary and Rotarians to be "*catalysts for transformational change*." She said that as leaders of our community, we know why we're here, but do others?

When she was being wooed by an unnamed, non-Rotary service club in Garland (got to be *Lions*), she asked the critical question, "*Why should I join*?" The answer was far from satisfactory, "*If you're anyone, you're part of the* ***** *Club of Garland*." She was active in the Chamber and a leader in the community, so she sought something more. She joined **THE** Rotary Club of Garland. ("*Chris, did you get that down*?")



She asked Brad Willis to explain why he was part of Rotary, and he replied, "When you become part of Rotary, you become a part of changing the World, one life at a time." Rotary, she says, "provided an opportunity to give back."

Sandy works with at-risk students, and so found herself in the Principal's Office one day. Α mother there recognized her as a Rotarian, and was moved to thank her



profusely for the Christmas gifts she'd given her son that the family could not do by itself since the mother was unemployed.

So Sandy urged us to "run to Randy with a filled out sheet" because that will permit us to change an at-risk student's life with a scholarship. And she encouraged us to continue our work with the Collin County Adult Clinic and the Plano Children's Clinic because they give purpose to THE Rotary Club of Plano.

She told us that this year's theme is Peace Through Service. And she suggested that we find peace within ourselves and "let it radiate out to our families, our friends, our neighbors, our community, and the World.

Then, noting that she didn't have "diarrhea of the mouth," she concluded with "Thank you for being Rotarians!"




