CAPTAIN KIRK was thanked for his efforts with **STUDENT CITIZEN OF THE YEAR**. Last night 28 trophies went to children in 7 schools; tonight 20 are awarded for 5 schools. (Those kids appear in the photo above.)

Nancy Humphrey, former President of the *PISD* Board of Trustees, introduced the winners of **TRACTER OF THE TRAR**. She said PISD received peer-reviewed candidates from all schools and had the unenviable job of choosing from within a pool of well-qualified teachers. Nancy preached to the choir, telling us that the teachers are *PISD's "biggest asset,"* and *"they make our children successful."* Then she turned to the winners themselves.

Cody McGregor, the 2017 *Plano ISD* **ELEMENTARY TRACTER OF THE TRAR**, has been teaching for 7 years, all of them at Schell Elementary. She is a 5th grade teacher, who, according to the *Schell* Principal, **Jeanne Basil**, "Cody is a leader on her campus and 'rocks' everything she does." Cody graduated cum laude from Texas Tech with a Bachelor of Science degree in multidisciplinary studies. In her own words, she describes her philosophy of teaching as:

"Teaching is not my job; it's my calling. Every day, I wake up blessed to serve in a school and a district that uphold my same values. With the support of my administration and colleagues, I make daily decisions by asking, 'What's best for these children?' I view my role as a teacher as both a responsibility and a privilege."



Cody is a teacher who truly makes a difference, and *Plano ISD* is proud to honor her as **ELEMENTARY TEACHER OF THE YEAR**.

Cody told us that she grew up in the *PISD* system to which she has now returned as a teacher. She thanked Ro-tary *"for what you do."*

She said that she's not great "about taking compliments," and so it was embarrassing for her to read the report cards she solicits from her students. She's just happy about the "great progress in the kids," but she winces a little when reading, "You should joke a little more, but you're <u>still</u> in my top five!" Another response, from a child with a "hard home life," chastened her to "read more to us." She concluded her



brief remarks with further thanks for Rotary's help.

Nancy continued, I'm pleased to introduce Kevin Moore, humanities teacher from *Shepton High School* and *Plano ISD* 2017 **SECONDARY TRACTOR OF THE YEAR**. Kevin has fourteen years of teaching experience, all of it at *Shepton High*.

Kevin earned a Master's degree in Curriculum & Instruction, specializing in Gifted and Talented Education from the *University of North Texas* and a Bachelor of Arts cum laude from *Southwestern University*. Kevin says that:

"I think it's important for my students to know that I am human. Every single year, I commit to taking this journey with them. Together we will celebrate successes, grow from mistakes, and learn about ourselves and others. I hope my students know, as I have learned from my humble beginnings as an 'apartment kid,' that it's not where you start that matters; it's where you go from there." According to **Jeffry Banner**, Shepton Assistant Principal, "Regardless of who he is teaching, Mr. Moore has a heart for kids and believes that all students can succeed."

We are honored to have Kevin representing Plano ISD as SECONDARY TRACTER OF

the year.

Kevin began by thanking Rotary "for the invitation and for all you do for our kids." He said that the PISD Education Foundation "gives so much to our kids."

He grew up in Plano, moved away then back to Plano



then on to Chicago until homesickness had a firm hold on him, and he was "*ready to come back to* Shepton." He was certified at *UT Austin*, and he marvels at the remarkable friendships he has made, kept alive at a distance via social media.

This time of year, everyone's "*in a sprint* to get to the end of the year, especially at Shepton" where a renovation is in progress. He loves teaching where "*the students support* each other" in study groups and in other ways.

In the Q&A that followed, Anthony Ricciardelli asked about who inspired them to become teachers. Cody responded that her 3rd grade teacher, **Sherry**, "was my biggest inspiration." As a consequence, perhaps, she became the Teacher's Pet, "helping her with her job." They are still in contact; Cody has "reached out to her to tell her of her inspiration."

Kevin spoke of **Debbie Holland**, who was his greatest inspiration. She encouraged him to pursue teaching in spite of his objection that "*teachers don't make any money*!" He remembers leading a raid on her home to awaken her at 1 am "*for her birthday*," having learned that her <u>real</u> birthday fell on Christmas, so she never got to really celebrate it. It was Debbie who "*got me connected*" with his peer group. "*Relationships are important*."

Ric Kasmiskie asked what resources they want more of and what less of.

Cody needed no prodding on that score. "More time," she said. She could use two more weeks at semester's end, attempting "to get everything done." Then too, she's "not ready to say goodbye!" She wants more time to "plan amazing things" for her students.

Kevin accused her of stealing his thunder, so he dittoed that and added that he could do with less of "*decisions made* (at State level) by people who have never been in teaching." He said that is "*unacceptable* <u>except</u> in Texas."



Alex Johnson wanted to know what makes *PISD* a great place to work and learn.

Cody cited the great teacher training and the push by *PISD* to always be moving forward. She marvels, e.g., at the *Chromebooks* acquired for the students. "*No other ISD can match.*"

Kevin spoke of his *"remarkable campus"* where diversity adds to the academic success. Students have the opportunity to *"learn from different points of view."*

King David anointed them both with \$500 checks <u>bearing two signatures</u>! Then he bestowed our invaluable desk organizers upon them, causing Cody to remark, "It has a clock!"

David asked Alex Johnson to stand and fêted him for the upcoming week's installation of our first Interact Club at *Jasper High School*. Then he led us in the Four-Way Test (in the absence of the banner on which it resides) and dismissed the assembled nobles at 12:55.


