David presented his one-year Plano Rotary Service pin to Robert Reed, noting that he'd been a member in Corpus Christi for many years. He also called for nominations for District Awards; the deadline is 31 July. He said he would help with the nomination process (download the form from the 5810 website), but he cautioned that his own nomination of Sainted Editor last year was somewhat ineffective. (Indeed, Best Bulletin wasn't even awarded.)

King David then turned our attention to the PROFIT & LOSS statements on our tables. On those, he had highlighted a couple of EXPENSES:

81075 Jack Carter Park 12,500 82025 PISD Health Sciences Academy 20,000

The latter represented the penultimate payment on our obligation to PISD for their health program; we've one more \$20,000 aliquot to go. The former represents the



final payment to the City of Plano that partially funded an All-Access playground in the newly-renovated park. It earned us a Rotary Wheel in the park and a plaque detailing our sponsorship of the playground.

These major projects represent a fraction of our charitable obligation. They have been funded out of our membership dues (the tax deductible portion), but, with our Incredible Shrinking Club, our membership has fallen from ~110 to ~76, so we cannot sustain this level of largesse unless we garner additional income. Thus the paramount importance of successful new fundraisers like **Blues**, **Brews & 'Ques**.

Indeed, more successful functions like that (will be), will enable us to actually reduce members' dues, and we're to "see me if you're opposed" to that. In fact, any questions about the Club's finances can be directed to King David or Exchequer Kelly Palmer (our Foundation Head).

Rick Blues Brother Horne gave us an update on the preparation for Blues, Brews & 'Ques two days hence. One day before the event (Friday), the fencing, tents and Port-a-Potties will arrive and be in place. Rick wasn't aware we needed health permits for sealed soda cans, but we do, and he has acquired them. He still needed volunteers for many tasks listed on the master roll, which he passed around so we could know for what and when we signed up.

Parking for volunteers was noted to be north of Oak Point Park's amphitheater. Volunteers get the furthest lot. The rest is designated VIP, and, of course, Jo Via gets to park there or "wherever the hell she wants." It's her park. We're incredibly grateful she has loaned it to us.



The BBQ vendors will also sell soda and water (and, perhaps, even soda water) as will our INTERACT student volunteers. Mary Jo Dean asked if the admission ticket gets you any food/drink. Rick said it's an admission ticket; it gets you only admission and, possibly, heatstroke as it's going to be (heat index) 104° in the afternoon. So you'd be well-advised to dress lightly and slather on sunscreen.

There'll be complimentary water for volunteers, but they're responsible for buying their own BBQ and (off-duty) beer.

Plano East is donating the mobile Green Room for artists, who will be selling their CDs and DVDs.

Rick thanked the sponsors: *Plano East*, **Casey Stewart**, Jason Kramer, **Kenny Wilson**, **Maria Mott**, among others. He also thanked the yeomen volunteers: Jo Via, **Johnny Lewis**, Dave McWhorter, Kelly Palmer, Sara Akers, and **Jim Cooper**.

The first act, **Eric Barton**, begins at 2:30. **Alan Feigenbaum** has the volunteers' tee shirts. Oh, and please wear sun glasses; you'll blend right in with performers hiding their dilated eyes.

As to the patrons, they mayn't bring coolers or food/drink but chairs and blankets are *de rigeur*. Also sun hats and sunscreen for everyone. So far, 75 tickets have been sold, not counting Rotary member sales. And, if you bought your tickets on-line, you'll get VIP parking; otherwise, you'll park in the Collin College lots across the street (paying in cash).

There'll be two ticket booths where patrons get wristbands colored by their age. Olin asked for a teenaged one.

Since Rick's explanation of the park's location and geography left some confused, Jo Via, Ms. Balloon Festival, took the mic and explained how to get there and what to look for. She lives and breathes Oak Point Park.

Kelly wanted to know the distance between the beer vendors and the potties. It's easy to guess why he's going.

Sara asked what Rick's most pressing need for volunteers is. That was easy: tear down. Currently, only Robert Reed is staying after 11 pm to help dismantle our presence. Vendors will pick up their rental items on Monday. Oak Point is OK with remnants on Sunday.

Also we're in need of three big coolers and several 100' extension cords. Volunteers handling the items, either in set up or tear down, need gloves to counter the splinters. They'll not have to bring chairs for volunteering, only for watching the show when their stint is over.

Several TV stations will be present to record the festival in the hour before sundown. Film at 11. "It'll be a little hot, but we'll all have fun!" As for consumption, "When you're off-duty, do what your liver tells you to do."

Jo Via introduced a late visitor, her grandson and Paul Harris Fellow, **Cooper Jackson**. Some of us remember him showing up in his first year.



King David led us in the Four-Way Test and closed the meeting right on the money, 1:00.
