**CAPTAIN KIRK** told us NOT to attend next week's lunch, since it will be a dinner instead.

In particular, it will be the induction dinner for a newly-minted **District Governor Ean Sullivan**. Since it's to be held at the *Frontiers of Flight Museum*, there'll be an F-4 ready into which Ean might attempt to shoehorn himself. **LENNY** reported "more happy faces" at Soap Box Derby this year than last and surmised that Plano is recognizing the annual event. **HE** said the 195 races, raffles, and sponsorships raised \$21,000 before expenses. **Ben Criste** would have reported this, but he was AWOL. So **LENNY** thanked him and awarded five RotarianS of the Month plaques to **David McWhorter**, **Kenny Wilson**, and Randy Wright, who were then present, and **Jim Cooper** when he deigned to show up. Kenny was also credited with producing *Memorial Elementary's* Yearbook. (Presumably Ben will get his ROTM in a fortnight.)

Obligatory self-congratulations out of the way, we were treated to more self-congratulation as **LB**, The President Formerly Known as **Prince**, took to the podium after a brief, unnecessary, introduction by **LENNY**. Past **Prince John Ernst**, former President then recaptured President (after **Brad Shanklin** decamped), former Director of the *Heard Museum*, and current Director of the *Collin County Adult Clinics*, held out 3 butcher knives to be juggled by twirling expert **Howard Shapiro**, but Howard demurred saying he'd worried about beaming someone with a *baton*!



John amended the title of his talk to “*Indigent Healthcare as Witnessed by Me and Supported by Rotary.*” Toward that end he enumerated the medical munificence to which we’ve been allied:



1. *Plano Children’s Medical Clinic*
2. *Done in a Day* (dental clinic)
3. *Collin College’s Nursing Program*
4. *Collin County Adult Clinic*

His first love, of course, is CCAC, started by **Julia Grenier**, a nurse working out of her car at the *Plano Day Labor Center*. Soon **St. Marks Catholic Church** offered the *Angel of the Day Labor Center* rooms to create a Thursday night clinic on their campus. And in 2005, they, Plano Rotaries, the City, and individuals contributed to the creation of CCAC.

It began as four hours of volunteer effort on one night a week seeing 60 patients, but it seemed a waste of the 4,000 sq. ft. facility on Park across from *Poor Richards*. So the Board pulled on its boots, hired John, and did the unthinkable: ask its clients what they needed.

“*The first change was the hardest:*” opening a second night (Tuesdays). But the results “*were significant.*” The instituted *Project Access* with the help of **Dr. Christopher Crow**; it involved doing the \$100 primary care, which would otherwise cost the hospitals \$2-15,000 at the ER, and sending patients who actually required hospitalization to area hospitals where they were treated free under indigent care guidelines. All of this saved the County oodles of money: a case of win, win, win.

When **St. Andrews** demonstrated, with a food bank, an indigent clientele on the west side (!), CCAC opened up a West Side Clinic on their campus, including a Women’s Clinic. All of this was supported by the vision and venue of **Suzanne Henry** (widow of **Dr. Terry Henry**) with startup funding from area hospitals.

Some 19,000 people on the east side fit the parameters for medically underserved, so Federal funding is available. Now that original facility is staffed 8 hours a day, Monday through Friday. To retain federal dollars, 51% of the CCAC Board has been replaced by cli-

ents, and they’re working well! The West Side Clinic is still staffed 100% with volunteers. A new facility has arisen at the *Plano Housing Authority* treating their clients. John thanked **Earnest Burke** for invaluable assistance there. *LifePath* is providing exam rooms and mental health personnel. There is a new HIV-AIDS testing program and a growing Cancer Treatment Program including chemotherapy on site and free to qualified populations. Mammography is offered, and if anything untoward is discovered, *Presby* treats it free. Free PAP smear tests are offered. Nothing like this has ever arisen in the County.

New clinics are on the rise: *UT Southwestern* has opened a branch on our southern border, *Baylor* has commenced another, and a third is opening in the mosque at the *Islamic Center*. All will be part of *Project Access*. And John says he owes it all to **Ken, Ean, James, Myrtle, Susan**, and the whole crew. Well done.

Pixie that he is, **Herb Hoxie** asked if the IRS had approved CCAC as a charity. John said both they and CMS had approved it. CCAC and its affiliates constituted two of the seven unconditionally accepted institutions.

Susan wanted to know the definition of “*indigent.*” It varies by program and county. Collin uses 100% of federal poverty (\$22K for a family of 4), but some use only 21% while Dallas, utilizing extra funds, uses 200%. John said that even **Bill Gates** would be treated, of course at full cost.

Ean wanted to know the savings for the county vs. ER primary care. John couldn’t tell him any costs except CCAC’s \$100 a visit.

**LENNY** presented him with \$10,000 for Rotary’s part of the Cancer Clinic startup funding, and gifted John with the coveted dog tags. John tried to thank him with the wireless mic, but as it wasn’t working, he leaned toward the lectern mic to do so. **LENNY** mentioned resisting the urge to flee to Europe with Wayne Hendrick’s birthday cash.

Randy Wright cautioned John about the two-second warm-up delay in the wireless mic, **LENNY** led everyone in our Four-Way Test, and **HE** belled us out at 1:01.
