David McWhorter delivered an oration in praise of former Plano West footballer and current NFL star, Jordan Pugh. Not surprisingly, it was from a press release by the JORDAN PUGH Annual Scholarship program for a PWSH football player who



"exhibits passion, performance, and purpose." It would fill out the remainder of

the Weekly Reader if quoted verbatim, so I'll summarize.

- Texas A&M cornerback & safety
- B.S. Business with Communications and Sports Management minors
- At A&M he posted 212 tackles, 4 interceptions
- 2010 Carolina Panthers
- 2012 Washington Redskins
- Instituted the **Pushing Upward.** Going Higher™ Award at PWSH in 2012
- CEO of Jordan Pugh Enterprises, LLC, a communications company.

He says that he created the scholarship "to show my appreciation and the respect I have for Coach Mike Hughes and the Plano West football program. I also wanted to recognize and give back to a student on the team who continually demonstrates hard work on the field and off the field, a team leader who displays athletic passion, community purpose, and academic performance.'



Dominique sprung to her task as Technology Assistant and started the promotional video for the Scholarship. It highlighted Jordan's alliterative theme of Passion, Purpose, and Performance. At its conclusion, Jordan explained: "Without knowing your purpose, there is no strength. Without

strength, there's no passion. Without passion, there's no performance." He announced the title of his talk: Never Forget the Leftovers. Sainted Editor perked up, but it wasn't about yesterday's savories.

Jordan told us about being the local kid who makes good. At PWSH, he played multiple sports and snagged a scholarship to TAMU where he pleased his family by graduating in 3½ years. He received many honors there, including the football team captainship. His goal (purpose) all along was to play in the NFL.

To do that requires a "protocol."

- Get an agent.
- Start in an all-star game.
- Be tested in an NFL Combine.
- Get coached in private workouts.
- 5. Wait for Draft Day.

But he described his own traversal of this regimen as "a detour." Although he had assiduously pursued step 4, no all-star game beckoned him, nor did an NFL Combine require his talents. So, upon 10 March 2010, when came his Pro Day, he discovered that he'd have finished in the top 5 in all the combine categories for which he was qualified. It was for naught, as his talents appear to



have been unobserved. He consoled himself with the observation that "waiting for what you need is better than having what you want.'

He was invited, fruitlessly as it turned out, to work out with the *Chicago Bears*. He ran quickness drills, watched by "Jeff," one of their many talent scouts. At their conclusion, Jeff sat him down and explained the Bears had their eye on two others for his position, and one of them would be accepted. Jordan fumed about wasting his and the team's time, and mused that, with 32 teams in the League,



he'd make it elsewhere, and he vowed that Jeff "would remember me."

Then it was 23 April, the 3rd day of the draft, and Jordan's cell phone had not rung. His name had not shown up on the TV's list. He was imaging that his life's work (as short as his life had been to that point) was "worth nothina."

His Dad asked, "Are you mad?" Jordan could not but admit to anger. "I cannot figure out why I'm being overlooked!" His Dad agreed with that assessment, but then asked the unobvious question, "Are you mad at God?"

Jordan couldn't answer that, so his father asked for Jordan's cell phone and suggested that he walk around the neighborhood, venting at the Almighty, if necessary. Jordan balked; to be without a phone on draft day is unthinkable. But he did as Dad asked.

He wandered disconsolately along the streets until he finally asked the question of God, "Where do You want me to be? I'll be there." Within 30 seconds, his father pulled up in the family car, demanding Jordan come to answer the home phone (for he had misplaced Jordan's cell)! The General Manager for the Carolina Panthers was on the line asking, "How's your day going?" Jordan said that

he'd "hoped for better." The manager then put him out of his misery by telling him that he had been chosen.

The Panthers had never seen him in action, but they had waited patiently in the wings. From all of this, Jordan distilled the following:

- 1. It's OK to be angry.
- 2. Know when to surrender.
- Ignore what you can't see, hear, or

he ended up with Washington. Jordan told her that he was cut by the Panthers, and he's glad of it. He's won more games in one season than he did in all his time with Carolina. Susan mused, "You played the Cowboys? That's


