Dave McWhorter prefaced his introduction of Scott Wagley with "Is Randy here?" Dave also sponsored Michael Seates who welcomed Angelo Priez. Johnny Lewis introduced Chuck Ruckel, and Randy Brodhead fed daughter, Kristen.

The *Geriatric Club of Plano* earned its name as **Bill Wray** was congratulated on his 100th birthday. At least that was the amount on his birthday check. **Jamie Schell** didn't appreciate the precedent.

Kyle Walters picked up his 13-year pin to a round of applause.

Rick Horne spoke about *Camp RYLA* for which he is our designated hitter. He works with InterACT to select RYLA scholars. The Camp will be held on 8-13 June and



involves rising seniors in a *"life-changing experience."* Participants often go on to RotorACT.

District 5810 sponsors some 160 students. *Plano Rotary* is responsible for four of those but actually picks and sends six; the extra two are funded by *Metro*. All our students are drawn from *Plano Senior High. Sunrise* covers

PESH, and *Metro* covers *PWSH*. Students with 3.9+ GPA qualify for interviews held this year in a 7-hour stint on March 27th. Rick says they're all worthy of going, and deselecting those not funded is a challenge.

During the event, he needs two drivers per vehicle to ferry the students to and from the RYLA site. Those available should volunteer to Rick.





LENNY reminded us that it's not too late to sign up for the 5810 Gala, which, as you read this, is now passed. He also pointed out that world polio cases have fallen from 22 last year to 9 this year. So we're "*almost there*." **Gary Basham** reiterated the phrase in connection with our attempts to become a 100% *Paul Harris Fellow* Club, deucedly difficult for a club our size. Only five more members to go. He announced that **Lynette** had turned \$11,000 into the Foundation for our Paul Harris commitment.

Larry Flannery told the congregation that Francis was not his choice for Pope. He was rooting for *Pope Sicela* of Milan and has heard the furloughed pontiff referred to as *Ex-Benedict*. Bruce Glasscock piled on with a comment about **Rick Perry** being considered for Pope, but he failed the interview when he referred to "*The Father, the Son, and … and … and …*" **FLASH** also reminded us that we have to get "off the hook" before LENNY'S "regime" ends. LENNY let it be known that HE had until June 27th.



David McWhorter introduced **Rayzor Dent**, author of "*Vaulted Eagles*," which has vaulted to 1,962,128th place on Amazon!

Texas-born writer Rayzor Dent has spent most of his life in the American Southwest. As an Air Force instructor pilot flying aircraft from bases in Texas, New Mexico, Arizona, and California, Rayzor gained a unique perspective of the

country's physical beauty and magnitude. Later, while working at universities in both New Mexico and Texas, he became fascinated with the area's culture and rich history.

Rayzor has written short stories and poetry as well as regional and national magazine articles. The historical fiction, *Vaulted Eagles*, is his first novel. He is a member of the *Western Writers of America* and a Paul Harris Fellow. He and his wife of 39 years, **Nancy**, met during their freshman year at *SMU*, raised their two children in Las Cruces, New Mexico, and now live in Dallas.

Rayzor's topic is "Would Santa-Anna be a Good Rotarian?"

He praised Rotary, admitting that there might be a few "decent people" in Lion's or Kiwanis. And he said that "without Rotary's 1.2 million members to serve and do the right thing, the world would be a much different place." He wanted us to imagine the world before **Paul Harris**. He asked us to time travel with him to meet historical individuals who might be considering joining our Club.

He has travelled to the middle of the 19th Century, a time when Mexico was under transition from the second largest country in the world (after China, presumably). In the course of researching his book, he "met" many extraordinary people in the 1836-1855 span: Stephen F. Austin, Jim Bowie, Davy **Crocket**, and arguably the most important man in U.S. history, Antonio Lopez de Santa-Anna.



Eleven times the President of Mexico, he is best remembered for the Battle of the Alamo. He failed the first of the Four-Way Tests in 1833 when he ran for election the first time on a liberal ticket. But once in of-



fice, he abolished the Constitution and set himself up as dictator.

He failed the second test when he reformed church, state, and military, which proved to be fatally unpopular with important people, so he blamed it all on his Vice President, and "led a bloody coup against his own administration!"

He failed the third test by such callous handling of his own people that they fought against him "to the last man." He slaughtered 1.200 men, women, and children "sympathizers" for "permitting the rebels" to exist in Zacatecas. So all of Mexico knew of what he was capable.

He failed the last test during the Gadsden Purchase. Under his bumbling leadership, Santa-Anna had lost the Mexican/American war, ceding vast swaths of the American Southwest to the U.S. (see map on previous President Franklin Pearce sent page). James Gadsden, Ambassador to Mexico, to purchase railroad rights of way in what became southern Arizona and New Mexico. He was authorized to spend as much as \$15M on the deal which was to have included Baja California. But the partisan bickering in Washington (sound familiar?) concerned the Baja becoming a slave vs. a free state, so that part of the purchase was rescinded, and Gadsden only got the 30,000 square miles for \$10M. The \$10M fled Mexico with Santa-Anna when his fortunes fell.

But Santa-Anna returned to his beloved 480K acre estate to suspend the Freedom of the Press and abolish all state congresses. Apparently, you can't teach an old dog new tricks.

Rayzor said that the "most sobering" thing he learned in his research is "how dangerous the wrong man with power" can be. He couldn't, in good conscience, recommend Santa-Anna as a Rotarian, but he insisted that others of his acquaintance in the era would serve well.

Scary Bol Epstein asked how America won the Mexican war. Rayzor responded that it was through the overwhelming incompetence of Santa-Anna. He fought more battles than did Napoleon and Washington combined, but he apparently learned nothing from them.



LENNY said that the talk has indeed taught him a great deal about consolidating power, and so June 27th may only be a suggestion. HE presented Rayzor with OPERATION ONCE IN A **LIFETIME** dog tags and told the congregation that the author would be autographing books after the meeting.

After referencing Jeff Crilley's talk, Marketing Without a Budget, next week, PRESIDENT LENNY led us in the Four-Way Test and belled us out at 1:01.
