
Gerald Brence popped up to note that his guest, *Plano West* Girls Soccer Head Coach Carley Phillips, had been omitted from the introductions.

This week, however, the speaker was ex-President Clean, our esteemed City Manager, Bruce Glasscock. Chuck Morgan introduced him, explaining that he was here to fête the CITY EMPLOYEE



about Bruce's credentials, Chuck explained that he has his B.S. in Criminal Justice with a

M.S. in Public Administration. He began his Plano

career as Police Chief in 1990, moonlighted as Assistant City Manager starting in 1998, and finally relinquished his cops to **Greg Rushin** in 2001. He took over for (the shy and) retiring **Tom Muehlenbeck**, inheriting a \$400M budget and 2,000 city employees. Along the way, he earned international attention as the President of the Association of Police Chiefs in 2001.



Bruce first thanked Karla for having hosted City Councilman Harris; that meant that she, not the City, paid for his meal. She's being good to the budget.

He explained that the beauty of the process is that the City employees themselves nominate the CITY TEAR, of which there were 16 candidates this year. A review team makes the final decision, but it's nice to know there are that

many exemplary folk in City employ.



Noting that he's "not sure who's [left] working" in the City, he introduced Director of Technology Services, David Stephens, Systems and Programming Manager, Danny Housewright, City Councilman Pat Gallagher, and Assistant City Managers LeShon Ross and Frank Turner. He also drew our attention to Michele Haram from Central Market.



The Man of the Hour was **Rick Figueroa**, who began as a Database Administrator in 1997 but is now a Senior Programmer Analyst responsible, among other things, for all City employee paychecks. Bruce surmised, "That's more important that what <u>I</u> do!" No wonder he was nominated!

As an example of Rick's dedication, Bruce related an anecdote in which Rick texted back to the office instructions on how to deal with a problem that had arisen while he was enduring a root canal at his dentist's. The problem solved, payroll was not missed.

Dave Stephens told us that Rick has an excellent attitude, and when he can't answer a question "off the top of his head," he is willing to do whatever it takes to come up with the right answer.



Explaining that even though Rick is responsible for the entire system, Dave told us he can focus on the problems of a single employee until they are solved. He "exemplifies what a good employee should be." So saying, he presented Rick with a bouquet that was mercifully taken over by wife Diana Figueroa!

Mayor Phil Dyer spent allotted his time recognizing City mavens like Lissa Smith. Lee Dunlap. Nancy Humphrey, and Carrolyn Moebius. Then he thanked Plano Rotary for deal" the "bia of CITY employee OF THE STATE TEAR honors, and said that those



"16 superstars make us look good." He held up a Proclamation but promised not to read it, because it would expose that he "wasn't a graduate of the Plano School System."

Phil explained that Rick works with PeopleSoft (a management system that stymies UT Dallas to this day; they could use Rick's help!), making overnight updates to ensure minimal disruption to City offices.

Bruce displayed Rick's portrait that will hang in City Hall lobby for one year, after which he may have it "to do with as you wish."

10-year anniversary, presented Rick with "organic treats" in an ornate basket, mercifully taken over by Ms. Figueroa.



The Honoree was then presented with the microphone, and he thanked G*d, his Mom and Dad, Diana,

and his daughter. With the birth of his youngest, he and Diana wanted to travel less. A friend was working for a municipal government and recommended it to Rick. Thus, he became the first employee in the City hired by a web page advertisement! But their email server at the time was *Higgins*, a museum piece that was serving only one other institution in the world. Everything ran on an HP 3000 mainframe.

Rick said he did the conversion of 500 City computers to Win95 at night (to minimize disruptions). And he was impressed by Bruce's use of a Palm Pilot (which he and Bruce still use).

Rick believes the key to problem solving is the effective sharing of knowledge. He still thinks Plano is the best place to work and live.

Drince John offered Rick our Four-Way Test coin and promised a donation to Shoes for Orphan Souls in his name. Then he scoured the audience, looking for Bruce. When John found him, staring up from the nearest table, he said, "All those suits hid you!"
