KIRK asked more of us to sign up for the May 28th Student Citizen of the Year

Banquet here at the *Southfork Hotel*. He said that we're honoring 24 kids (and their parents), **Cary Israel** will address the gathering, and all eyes will be on MISS TEXAS. Cary complained that he didn't want to have to compete with MISS TEXAS, but KIPK noted, "It's no contest."

Club President of the Year, KIRK, wanted us all to know that DG Ean was NOT on the Awards Committee. (But, in truth, he was...just not voting.) Plano Rotary also won Club of the Year which is "a tribute to you and how much you do." And KIRK expects us to accomplish much more because "Earnest's hair's on fire." He quoted a Zone representative to the effect that "Rotary isn't a



Service Organization with Members. It's a Member Organization that does Service." Beyond Service, Rotary is "friendship, fellowship, and business networking" that permits us to get "enormous things done together."

# Dave McWhorter rose to introduce Scary Bol.

In addition to his profession with *Merrill Lynch*, Bob devotes many hours to other causes.

Bob has served for 19 years in Law Enforcement Reserves and Homeland Security, including four years with the Dallas Sheriff's Reserves and three years with the Texas State Guard, 19th Military Police Brigade.

Bob has been deeply involved in various fundraising events for several causes, including **Wounded Warriors**, **SNOWBALL EXPRESS**, Folds of Honor, and North Texas Crime Commission.

Bob has served as Fundraising Co-Chairman for Israel Bonds, Congregation Shearith events, and Temple Shalom events.

Bob is married and has five children. Bob's hobbies range from shotgun shooting, archery, and mountain biking to painting, singing and singing in his Synagogue's Choir. Bob's topic is *The Russian/Crimea Crisis*.

As Bob strode to the podium, someone asked, "Can you turn off the microphone?" But it was a premature concern; Bob didn't have to use it.

After stumping for our involvement with organizations like *Operation Law Enforcement* and the Dallas Sheriff's Department, he settled into his talk. He quoted **Andriy Deshchytsia**, Ukraine's interim foreign minister as say-

ing that it is impossible to hold elections in the middle of a civil war. He holds that Eastern and Southern Ukraine are in a war backed by Russia.



Bob gave us an historical outline. He called upon members to give the event that transpired on these dates:

- August 1991 Ukraine declares independence from Russia backed by a 90% vote of its citizens.
- 2004 The Orange Revolution (someone inquired if *UT* had won a national championship) followed "widespread vote rigging" that resulted in the "election" of **Victor Yanukovych**, the government's man, over **Victor Yushchenko**, the opposition candidate. Under pressure from the international community, a second runoff was held in which Yushchenko prevailed.
- 2010 V. Yanukovych won "free and fair" election and undid the reforms following the Orange Revolution.
- 2011 Yanukovych jails the opposition.
- 2013 Kiev sees 100,000 protesting moves to distance Ukraine from the European Union and NATO.

Meanwhile, back at the ranch, **Vladimir Putin** was born into "a modest family" in 1952. He joined the KGB and was sent to East Germany to recruit spies. (By the fall of the Soviet Union, it was estimated that every 3<sup>rd</sup> person was a paid informant.) Putin rose quickly through the ranks to become **Yeltsin's** right-hand man. Yeltsin made him Head of Security Services, and he became Prime Minister. When Yeltsin stepped down, Putin became President (for life...with minor interruptions to satisfy constitutional requirements of term limitation).

- 2013 To encourage alignment with Russia, Putin buys Ukraine's debt and cuts the price of petroleum products to the country.
- March 2014 Russian Parliament annexes Crimea. Anti-terrorist measures are taken against pro-Western populations. When three anti-Western figures are killed, Putin declares that all of Ukraine is heading into civil war. 50 are killed in Odessa.

Crimea is a strategic region. Russia's Black Sea Fleet is based there according to treaty. Almost 60% of the population is ethnic Russian. The language is Russian. It is important to Bob because his family hails from Ukraine. His great-great-grandfather served under Washington in the Army of the Potomac.

Contrasting Western Ukraine, the language is Ukrainian. 58% of Ukrainian gas comes from Russia. 66% of European gas imported from Russia passes through Ukraine.

Russia covets oil fields in the Black Sea. But all of Crimea's water comes from Ukraine. Ukraine's military budget is \$2B while Russia's is \$69B. Russia has 3,000 tanks



Ukraine's 730, and 1,400 helicopters to its 200. Ukraine has only 1% of Russia's 2,200 military aircraft.

AUSA forecasts that Russia can easily conquer Eastern Ukraine, but they'll have to contend with pro-Ukrainian guerilla forces. Logistics will be difficult for both sides.

The West has imposed financial sanctions on Putin's inner circle but not Putin himself or the trade infrastructure. Europe opposes trade restrictions since 27% of Italy's petroleum comes from Russia.

The sanctions are ineffective. Russia has the world's 8th largest economy at \$2T. It is asymmetric in its trade: with the U.S., Russia is ranked the 20th trading partner, while with Russia, the U.S. is its 5<sup>th</sup> largest. It is more symmetric in Europe: the EU is the 2<sup>nd</sup> largest partner with Russia while Russia is the 3rd largest trader in the EU.



Russia's nuclear arsenal is 2nd only to the U.S. with China a close 3rd.

The UN is powerless to address this situation because Russia has the veto on the Security Council. The General Assembly can only pass NON-BINDING

rulings. So Russia is free to "swallow up most or all of Ukraine," then turn its attention to Moldavia and the Baltic countries.

The precedence set by unopposed aggression is disastrous. Neighbor could cannibalize neighbor without fear of retaliation. (Of course, smaller nations are more easily intimidated by world wrath.)

Bob recommended the books Man Without a Face and Russia: A Short History.

When asked for a prognostication, Bob suggested that Putin is out to restore the Soviet Union.

Mark Waterbury explained that Stalin had forcibly relocated Ukrainian farmers to Russia, trading them out for Russian farmers then starved 2 million of the former.

Bob said that, prior to the breakup of the Soviet Union, Ukraine held its 3rd largest stockpile of nuclear weapons. It divested itself of those in exchange for a guarantee of defense from the West, a defense that is not being mounted now that the crisis has come.



Handing the Coveted Clock to Bob, KIRK commented that it was the Clock that "put us over the top" in the competition for Best Club!

Lenny announced a Foundation meeting following immediately (then found no quorum for it). Gene Champagne announced that his daughter had won a Girl Scout award. Not to be outdone, Carrolyn Moebius said that her son had made Eagle Scout. Mark Waterbury noted that his eldest son was named Newcomer of the Year. And Randy Wright noted that his daughter had two graduates, one from UT, the other fro PESH.

KIRK explained away his Best President Award by saying, "Check out Ean's new ride." Then he led us in the Four-Way Test and gonged us gone at 12:59.
