Andy stumbled a bit with his duties and LENNY had to prompt him. The Visiting Dignitaries were amused again. Finally, we greeted John





David McWhorter rose to give an egregiously dignified introduction to **Dr. Bob Biard**.

Dr. Biard lives in Richardson, TX, where he recently retired as the Chief Scientist of the Micro Switch Division of Honeywell. He is a Life Fellow of the Institute of Electrical and Electronic Engineers (IEEE), the recipient of the Patrick E. Haggerty Innovation Award from Texas Instruments, recipient of the Honeywell Lund Award, and a Distinguished Alumnus of Texas A&M University (spontaneous cheers) where he holds the position of Adjunct Professor of Electrical Engineering. He is also an inventor with 75 U.S. and foreign patents. Two of his most notable patents are the gallium arsenide light emitting diode (LED) and the Schottky clamped silicon logic circuits. In 1991, he was elected to the National Academy of Engineering.

We thought he might give us a talk on the Impact of Fiber Optics on the Texas business climate; however, we decided that might be a little heavy for this occasion. Instead, we are going to see a different side of Dr. Biard's talents—this program will be musical.

In addition to his technical accomplishments. Dr. Biard is also a world famous musician. He studied in Paris, and has performed all over the U.S., Canada, Mexico, and Europe. He is a star of stage, radio, TV, and records. Just back from his recent engagement at the Sands Hotel in Las Vegas, Nevada, we are pleased to present Dr. Bob Biard!



He opened his violin case, applied rosin to his bow, and took out his priceless wood saw. He sat down and rendered There's No Place Like Home to a round of amused applause.
