

#### Bob's topic was **D-DAY—BATTLE FOR FREEDOM**



Bob was upfront about his motive: he has been giving this lecture or one like it a couple times per week to Rotary Clubs in hopes that he can increase the membership in the *Association of the U.S. Army* (AUSA). Toward that end, he had brochures on all our tables labeled CIVILIAN, implying that it isn't only military who are welcome in their ranks. He hopes also to raise \$1-2 million this year for *Wounded Warriors*, an organization supported by the AUSA.

He first asked for veterans to stand and be recognized; then he wanted a show of hands of those who had veteran or currently serving military. He said that he's been teaching military history back to the Maccabees (160 BCE),



however, this was not a reference to his tenure but rather the breadth of his subject matter. He comes by this fascination naturally. His Father dropped paratroopers behind enemy lines on D-Day! His greatgrandfather didn't follow the family to the California Gold Fields but rather joined the Russian Army, eventually

arriving in America to join the 27<sup>th</sup> Regiment of the Army of the Potomac, narrowly missing **William Randolf Hearst's** Spanish American War.

True to his warning of an interactive presentation, he asked us why D-Day worked. Many of us had part of the answer that he wanted (misdirection to Calais, etc.), but Bob maintained it was **Hitler's** refusal to release the Panzers, 60% of which were slogging away in Russia on **Napoleon's** misguided quest.

He asked us what the **Piccadilly Circus** was. It was the code name given the largest armada (5,000 ships) ever assembled.

He inquired about who wanted to be the Field Commander, and he told us that **Eisenhower** won out over General **George Marshall**. (George had the last laugh with his superb exit strategy, *The Marshall Plan*.)

Then he took pity on us dumb bunnies and gave us the blow-by-blow account. After midnight, the British secured the bridges, denying an easy counterattack. Paratroopers drowned in bogs or were killed landing in Nazi strongholds. Junior officers took charge when their superiors were KIA and managed to cut lines of communication.

Another reason for D-Day's success was the decimation of the Luftwaffe. The Allies had secured air supremacy in advance and had flown 11,000 sorties prior to D-Day!

**Teddy Roosevelt, Jr.**, went ashore with the first wave and returned to the beach time and time again, earning the Medal of Honor. Unfortunately, it had to be awarded posthumously, as he had succumbed to disease a few weeks later.

Bob touted *The Longest Day* and *Saving Private Ryan* as historically accurate portraits. High seas swamped landing craft; soldiers who had feasted at breakfast became seasick and went to the bottom with their gear strapped to them. 60% of tanks didn't make it ashore. There was a "tangle of obstructions" on the beach, and the Germans had made "good use of the cliffs." Intelligence failures left machine gun emplacements unknown to the attackers. Destroyers, ignoring orders, came dangerously close the beach to give close support.

He told the story of TAMU football coach Lt. Col. James Rudder who took command of his unit, storming an undamaged bunker with a range on both Utah and Omaha beaches. He used ladders borrowed from London's Fire Dept. to scale the cliffs and take it out. Starting with 225 men, he ended with only 100, saving the 34,000 on Omaha.

Had D-Day not succeeded, Bob contended, the war would have been extended 1-2 years. Although **Rommel** was at home, his army could have been thrown it, but Hitler considered Normandy a feint and kept them at Calais. Allied bombers decimated those troops when they were committed to Normandy.

2500 died on Omaha. 1200 Canadians were lost. 3000 British perished. Allies expected poison gas to leave 50,000 dead, but by the evening of D-Day, they'd landed 100,000 on the beaches.

In response to LENNY'S question about the stiffness of resistance on Omaha, Bob said that that beach had been considered a prime target.

**Sherman Millender** asked about the influence of the bad weather on the four preceding days. Bob spoke instead of the unequal forces, e.g., 21,000 Allies vs. 2,000 Axis on Gold beach.

**Wayne Hendrick**, a veteran of the invasion, told us the image of the paratrooper hanging from the church was real.

**LENNY** gave Bob **OOIAL** dog tags, led us in the Four-Way Test, and released us upon an unsuspecting world at 12:57.
