



McCullough, Coach of the Plano Wildcats, had a formula for success.

- Winning 1.
- A winning attitude
- Integrity of character
- Leadership

He reminded us of Captain Miller, a leader of men on Omaha Beach on the 6th of June 1944. Although faced with bloody distractions, including his own head wound, he shouted, "Get to the seawall," demonstrating the overcoming of adversity.

He's interested in "growing leaders in school and the community" even though there are 6,000 teenage alcoholics, 13 suicides a day, and 43% of teenagers pregnant. (Sounds a bit high; familyfirstaid.com quotes the rate as 34%.) He's convinced such growth "doesn't just happen," but rather results from attitudes that don't "just quit." He recommends, "If you accept it, expect it." And your charges will present it.



"We are the product of people in our life," he said, "Parents, grandparents, teachers, coaches..." He gave his life as an example. He dreamed of becoming an NFL player, and he was given "permission to dream." Although he fell short, he "felt the love," as it is with all his coaches who "hug the players after a game." Even his daughter has written him,

"Win or lose, I still love you."

Continuing the sound bites, Coach McCullough concluded, "The world needs more stepping up to the plate (odd metaphor for football) and less beating about the bush. It needs character."

Last up was Plano West Wolves Coach, Mike Hughes. He explained that he comes from a family steeped in education. He has been so for 31 years. Indeed his son is a chip off the old block, coaching for his Dad.



The Wolves are in the basement with 0-4 at present, rendering Mike as turning from the best coach to a "worst one in a hurry." But he still thinks they've a shot to make playoffs.

He spoke of a kid who had violated the Athletic Code of Conduct and was heading out of the program (if not to jail), and Coach Hughes told him to hang out with his team

players and not the bad company that led him into error. "Iron sharpens iron," he said. The kid had made "a bad decision," but his leniency "made a difference in his life."

He stresses punctuality, a simple virtue.

His wife is a teacher at Shepton High, and he considers himself "the luckiest man in the world."




