Prince John called upon "the vociferous Robert Epstein" (Scary

Bol, to you) to introduce the day's speaker. Bob told us that West Point graduate, **COL. JOHN ANTAL**, was an Airborne Ranger and Tank Commander who has served with combat units in Germany, Korea, Kuwait, and here in Texas at *Fort*



Hood where he was the Operations Officer for the 3rd Armored Corps. He has guarded the bullion at Fort Knox and served as Special Assistant to the Chairman of the Joint Chiefs of Staff. Having retired from the military in '03, Col. Antal now authors books, produces films, and serves at the VP for Knowledge Operations for Plano's gearbox software, advising them on tactics and history for the **BROTHERS IN ARMS** videogame.



While he had promised to be brief, Col. Antal took the first 10 minutes of his talk recapitulating his introduction under the title of "Who is John Antal?," and "Why would you want to listen to him?" He said that he spent time in Kuwait training their military general staff. He has commanded a tank battalion in Korea (though not for the Korean War for which, unlike the majority of us, he was not yet born).

He told us that his hero is **George Washington**, and his heroine is his wife. He has published a dozen books, lectured, and led battlefield tours. His values, he says, are those of the U.S. Army: loyalty, duty, respect, selfless service, honor, integrity, and personal courage.

Having reintroduced himself, he turned to his topic, the perpetual occupation, nation building, and, perhaps, colonization of Afghanistan, because all of that worked out so well historically for the Macedonians, British, and Soviets. (Why should it be any different for us?) He's been studying Afghanistan since 9/11 and has come to the conclusion that no one understands it like the Afghanis. He found his interest in it via the Wounded



Warriors, and there are lots. However, Col. Antal points out that we've only lost 1,300 lives compared to the 2,500 lost on 6 June 1944 on the Normandy coast.



He has been to Kandahar (the 2nd largest city after the Capital at Kabul), and it was named after the first major invader, **Alexander the Great** of Macedon in 330 BCE. The supreme egoist named dozens of cities after himself (like Egypt's Alexandria) before expiring on the march 7 years later. Indeed, he named the city *Alexandria* which became corrupted to *Kandahar* in the local dialect. And his means of capturing the city were slaughter and enslavement, techniques unchanged in his trek across the Ancient World

Col. Antal described the next invaders as the British, but he left out the major players in Afghan history, the Arabs. Islam captured Kandahar in the 7^{th} Century and never left. Due to its strategic location on trade routes to India, the British coveted the town and lost their entire expedition (save a single man) in 1842. They invaded again in 1878-80, succeeding in colonization. But in 1919, Afghanistan recovered its independence.

It has been in civil war ever since 1970. When pro-Soviet factions began losing, the USSR intervened with their eventual "Vietnam" (helped on a bit by Rep. **Charlie Wilson's** [TX] *Stinger* missiles). (Indeed, at that time, the CIA <u>supported</u> the *Mujihadeen* among whose number was included one disaffected Saudi named **Osama bin**



Laden.) Only 8 years after the Russians retreated, the Taliban was in command, dispensing its own brand of Shari'a

Law, forbidding school for girls, among other enlightenments. They held sway from 1996 through 2001 when US forces routed them for their support of 9/11 via *Al-Quaeda*.

As of August 2003, NATO was in command of Afghanistan. In October of the next year, a

constitutional convention chose (a former Mujihadeen fundraiser), **Hamid Karzai**, to lead the then occupied nation.

By 2008, the Taliban were back with a vengeance. Their encroachment on a weakened government was countered in December of 2009 by the 30,000 troop surge by US forces. The UN hadn't been up to the task with its peacekeeping from the safety of its bases while the Taliban was beheading government collaborators across the majority of the land.

Gen. Stanley McChrystal developed a *Hearts and Minds* plan to use the populace against the Taliban. This involved surgical strikes (to minimize collateral damage) against an enemy hiding "amongst the people," sometimes using women and children as human shields. Unfortunately, some unguarded remarks in a *Rolling Stone* interview resulted in his dismissal.



The US is pursuing a strategy of working with tribal elders one-on-one to gain trust. But Col. Antal maintains that trust will dissolve when the US pulls out, and the Taliban and its beheadings return. Another part of the strategy involves sophisticated weaponry (*Predator* drones and precision missiles) to "disrupt" (kill) Taliban leadership. But that leadership has fled to safe havens

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in neighboring Pakistan, so Afghanistan remains at risk unless Pakistan chooses to assist.

But Pakistan is a basket state. Monsoon flooding has 1/3 of the country underwater. The population has lost whatever little faith it had an elected government Al-Quaeda has sworn to overthrow. Should they succeed, Al-Quaeda becomes a nuclear state (with access to the scientists and technicians necessary to adapt nukes to terrorist delivery systems). But, with Pakistan's permission, the US has targeted enemy strongholds with missiles every day this September. We are relying upon spies and informants in the Waziristan Province to keep enemy leadership in its bunkers, so Col. Antal claims.

Fortunately, in **Gen. David Petraeus**, we have a follower of the McChrystal Plan. He accepted a demotion to serve as the top commander in Afghanistan, and his motto is "We're in this to win."

Washington DC disagrees, in Col. Antal's opinion. The drawdown, to be begun by July 2011, is politically motivated to take Afghanistan off US hands "before the elections."

If we follow Petraeus, we continue the surge, degrade the Taliban, enhance the Afghan Government, make military deals with the Pakistanis, and stay a minimum of a decade until "the Taliban sues for peace or dissolves." We win. (Afghan history suggests otherwise.)

To lose, all we have to do is to pull out, leave the Afghan Government in the lurch, resulting in a Taliban victory, the concomitant bloodbath, a destabilized Pakistan, terrorists with nukes, and our return to fight another day. (But we won't be facing mere IEDs then.)

He concluded with the second verse of the National Anthem, which reads

On the shore dimly seen thro' the mists of the deep,

Where the foe's haughty host in dread silence reposes,

What is that which the breeze, o'er the

Lenny Schwartz asked about Russia's failure to conquer Afghanistan. Col. Antal said that we're trying to free the government of the Taliban, not to conquer. He said that the model is one of South Korea, where Democracy has taken hold (not to mention Capitalism), and it now serves as a buffer state against the communist North.

He was asked why we fail to "take out bin Laden?" He replied that Afghanistan is tribal. And bin Laden outspends the US in buying allegiances. Tino wanted to know how he accomplishes that, and Col. Antal responded "Saudi Arabia."

David Ellis asked what was stopping us in Afghanistan. Col. Antal said that neither China nor Russia want us to succeed there. And Pakistan holds the key to the power structure.



Herb Hoxie asked, "Where's Osama?" Col. Antal surmised that he's in Waziristan, and finding him will take Special Forces, like the Roman Special Forces that assassinated Hannibal.

In answer to a question about the role of the State Department, he replied, *"They're not there."*

Prince John said that the Club would buy one of his books and donate it to Collin College if he would but autograph it. Then he led us in the Four-Way Test and thrice honked us out at 1:01.

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




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
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
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
