Guatemala Literacy Project (GLP)

Internet connection is sketchy in the western highlands of Guatemala. I didn't want to miss the chance to write my message so I am writing this in advance. The seven Summit Rotary Guatemala travelers are visiting 10-12 elementary and middle schools. We are delivering textbooks to middle school students, witnessing a teaching program for teachers to learn how to teach reading at the elementary level, checking out new computer labs, and meeting with students who have earned scholarships to attend middle school. We are traveling in security protected vans and spend our evenings with 20 or so other Rotarians from around the US and Canada. We are seeing how the gift of literacy can be the road out of poverty.

Besides being participants in the Guatemala Literacy Project, the reason for our Guatemala trip is to lay the groundwork for a 2013 Global Grant from The Rotary Foundation (TRF).

To receive a Global Grant, clubs must follow certain procedures set forth by The Rotary Foundation (TRF). Project planning is a bottom-up and host club/district driven process. Mary Anne and I are meeting with our host club in Guatemala City to verify that we are meeting the elements of a successful project:

- 1) Sustainable- Communities are able to address their basic education and literacy needs after we have completed our work.
- 2) Measurable- We are able to identify measurable outcomes.
- 3) Community Driven- Project is designed by the host community based upon the needs that identified.
- 4) Aligned with an area of focus- The Guatemala Literacy Project falls under the area of focus called Basic Education and Literacy

The Rotary Foundation (TRF) grant process has been revamped. The New Grants Model takes effect July 1, 2013. In order to receive grant money, it is mandatory that at least one person in each club attend a session of the new grants model training. Call us overachievers, but between Butch, Bob Ashley, Jim Brook, and I we have attended 7 sessions.

We will conduct a needs assessment, set up communication with our grant partner, formulate a plan for financial management, plan for document retention, evaluation and reporting to our club, the District, and TRF.

I have mentioned previously that our goal is to grow our Guatemala Global Grant to well over \$100,000. This is how it works. Club funds are matched \$1 to \$1 with District Designated Funds (DDF). In addition, Club funds are

With this 3.5 to 1 match, a contribution of up to \$5000 from our club, AND the contributions of other clubs within our District, AND the contribution of clubs outside our own District our goal is achievable.

We will be working with the organization Cooperative for Education founded in 1996. Co-Ed has been operating in Cincinnati, Ohio and Guatemala City since 1996, and works with Rotary Clubs around the world to break the cycle of poverty through education in the western and central highlands of Guatemala. Co-Ed is the organization that runs the Guatemala Literacy Project (GLP) – the project that we are on. Bob Ashley has been involved with the GLP in his former club in Atlanta. Bob described this program as the most well run, effective, and organized project he has seen anywhere in the world. We can't wait to tell you about our work with the Guatemala Literacy Project.
