Where do all the Dollars Go?

You may recall a Tuesday Club Assembly presentation back in December where we talked about our fundraising dollars and where the money goes.

Here's a sampling of what we do locally. You can use this information when you are selling your Ice Melt tickets. Yes, EVERYONE please buy or sell your packet of 30. It's our fundraisers that allow us to *give back over \$100,000 to our local community every year*. In 2012, including sponsorships we raised slightly over \$130,000 to be given back in 2013. Approximately 10% of our budget goes to international work.

What do we do?

Community Dinner: We've served over 50,000 people a free dinner every Tuesday evening for 4 years

Troop Support: We send packages to local troops overseas, and support them when they get home $% \left({{{\mathbf{x}}_{i}}} \right)$

RYLA: We send 20-30 teenagers to this life-changing leadership conference each summer

Scholarships: \$15,000 to be awarded to Summit High seniors and to CMC students in 2013

Community Care Clinic: we've given over \$50k to purchase equipment in the last 7 years

Literacy: Local Projects from books for babies to high school writing projects, over 40 reading buddies in schools, dictionaries to every Summit 3rd grader, county wide reading program Summit Reads

Youth Exchange: we have both incoming and outgoing high school students on yearlong youth exchanges

Interact: A Rotary Club for high school age. We teach young people that service is a way of life

9 Health Fair, Make a Difference Day, free Thanksgiving Dinner: volunteer and organize.

Local Grants: Team Summit, Keystone Science School, CASA, Mountain Mentors, SOS, etc.

When I'm selling tickets, unless it's my friends who at this point ask me for tickets, I emphasize 3-4 of the above projects. I tell people to help Rotary do good things. They give us the money, we do the good things! Have fun. Be positive.

If you want to see where our club fundraising dollars go in more detail I posted the pie charts we used in the December Tuesday presentation on our club website.
