#### Rotary – Do you Feel It?

Why we love being Rotarians in Summit County... We snowshoe and sled, eat great food, serve at the Community Dinner, dress up for Mardi Gras, share smiles at Happy Hours, travel to others countries, teach students the value of leadership, and organize our neighbors at the 9Health Fair. There is always something to do when you are a member of the Rotary Club of Summit County.

So just what does it mean to be a Rotarian? Is that the same thing as being a member of the club? You might hear a story over the course of your Rotary life of when someone went from being a member of a club to being a Rotarian. To me it's a feeling. It's a feeling of giving, a feeling of Service Above Self. Don't run to RI with this, but I think that tag line is a little old school although I get the meaning.

When someone expresses an interest in our club, our wonderful Membership Chair, Peggy Beeler, contacts the person and explains our projects and activities. Peggy tells the interested party that our club *Makes Good Things Happen*, but in order to do good stuff, being a Rotarian takes time and money. We pay dues at \$200 a quarter, and very strongly suggest donating \$30/month to both our Charitable Fund and The Rotary Foundation. On top of the monetary contribution members need to 1) *volunteer for service projects* (9Health Fair, 4-Way Test, Make a Difference Day, Troop Support, Reading Buddies, Community Dinner), 2) *join a committee* (Literacy, Scholarships, International, Summit High Career Days, Youth Exchange, Fundraising, Local Grants), 3) *help us fundraise* (sell and/or buy your allocated Ice Melt and Car Raffle Tickets, volunteer at the BBQ), and one day we need you to 4) *chair a project or fundraiser*.

So who says when you've become a Rotarian rather than a member of a Rotary Club? YOU do. If you ask me, it's when a beautiful brown eyed child sits in your lap and reads to you. Or it's when a recipient of one of our scholarship students returns to express their gratitude for enabling her to earn a degree at CMC, a youth exchange student or RYLA grad grows into a giving, tolerant adult, a young person writes a letter of gratitude for a warm meal, a trooper writes a heart touching thank you note, or a student shows you a 4Way test coin that he has kept in his pocket.

What's crazy is when you are a Rotarian, it's easier to sell Ice Melt tickets because you've participated in the good things that we do. You FEEL the good. You KNOW that what we do is meaningful. Sharing that our Club gives back over \$100,000 to our community every year is most powerful when you've participated in the giving (service) not just the getting (fundraising).

Okay, so you're saying I *FEEL* it Joni, I'm a Rotarian, but it's *still* hard to sell my Ice Melt tickets. No worries just purchase your 30 tickets (simple, eh?). It would help the Ice Melt Committee if you can *return your manila envelopes with ice melt money and stubs* between now and the April 9 Tuesday meeting, but as you know, the contest officially ends when the clock falls through the ice so don't stop selling. Last year the clock went in the lake the earliest date ever on April 11.


