### COMMUNITY CARE CLINIC DONATION

The Summit County Rotary Club is pleased to donate a total of \$2,000 to the Community Care Clinic for the 2013 calendar year.

\$1,500 is a donation from our Club's Charitable Fund and \$500 is a donation from Bob Withers, Rotarian. The CCC has prioritized the purchased of a lap top computer with these funds.

The Summit County Rotary Club continues to be a proud Partner and Sponsor of the Community Care Clinic. Rotary has gifted CCC over \$50,000 in the last 10 years. In 2006 The Rotary Club of Summit County identified the Summit Community Care Clinic as our "Centennial Project"- 100th year anniversary of Rotary. Our club allocated \$40,000 to the Community Care Clinic for this project. Rotary dollars represented \$20,000 of the dental equipment cost and also supported an additional \$20,000 of medical equipment purchases. Since 2006 our Rotary Club has supported the CCC in the amounts of \$3,000 to \$2,400 for additional medical equipment.
