#### **Building Integrity - The 4 Way Test**

We say the 4 Way Test at the end of every meeting. Maybe you've used it to resolve an issue at work or to solve a dispute with a neighbor. But what if you were 12 or 13 years old and had to make an ethical decision?

That's what teaching the 4Way Test to Middle School students is about. Liz Wickert coordinates with our school leaders to bring the principals of the 4 Way Test to every  $7^{ extstyle{th}}$  grade student in Summit County.  $\,$  1-2 Rotarians present problems to a round table of 6-10 students. The students are then encouraged to resolve very real dilemmas using the 4Way Test. The goal is to build integrity by giving the students the tools to thoughtfully solve issues.

- You are watching your best friend's house while they were on a camping trip. The house gets robbed because you forgot to lock the door. What do you do?
- You have just recently been getting to be friends with a very popular person at school. He asks you for answers to a geometry quiz. What do you do?
- You are in Walmart and see your friend steal something and put it in his/her pocket. What do you
