Rotary Peak

Wouldn't it be great if we had a special place right here in Summit County, dedicated to the recognition of Rotary International and celebration of its service to the world? A place that is remote and wild, yet reachable on foot by most Rotarians and other visitors from near and far, where the views of our mountain wilderness extend for miles in all directions? It just might happen.

We've been working for the past few months with a small group of interested Rotarians from several other clubs in our Rotary District 5450, including Littleton, Evergreen, Mountain Foothills, Breckenridge Mountain, Clear Creek, Conifer, and Boulder. An unnamed peak, elevation 12,479 feet, is located right on the Continental Divide about two miles west of Loveland Pass, elevation 11,991 feet. An existing trail with limited elevation changes provides fairly easy access to this peak. We are proposing that it be named "Rotary Peak" and we have been soliciting letters of support from local governments, organizations, and elected state and federal representatives; several have already been received and many others are currently in process. Those letters will accompany our formal application to the US Board on Geographical Names, which has the official authority to confer names on such sites throughout the country. There's no assurance that the Board will approve our proposal, but we're optimistic as we continue the process.

One fine day in the not too distant future, we may find ourselves part of a special ceremony up there. Watch for your invitation!
