#### WEEKEND FROLICKS AT THE DISTRICT CONFERENCE...AND MORE!

What a fantastic weekend! The District 5450 Conference in Vail was inspirational, rewarding, and VERY fun. The speakers were outstanding coming from as far away as Russia (RI Representative Andrew Danikenko) and Kenya (Massai Chief Joseph) and as close as Denver (Karl Mecklenburg), and a Land Called Honah Lee (Peter Yarrow of Peter, Paul & Mary). Veteran District Conference merarked that this was the best District Conference they had ever attended, while first timers were signing up for next year. The fellowship and good times were over the top. It was an honor to have Summit County so well represented. We filled up THREE tables on Friday night and earned as many awards. The District Literacy Award went to Mary Anne and her Literacy Committee. The Ron Prascher Interact Service Award went to our Summit High Interact Club (under the leadership of Rob & Kim Phipps) and Rolo received the Ken Farrell Leadership Award. Congratulations everyone! The Rotary Club of Summit County rocked the halls on Friday night!

One of the highlights of the Conference is when all the Exchange Students in our District (about 30 kids) put on a Talent Show. **Our very own Simo was the MC for the event, with Marlies singing and dancing her way onto the stage.** It's such a pleasure to watch these kids interact – representing roughly 15 different countries. It doesn't matter what language they speak or where they are from. These young people now have a common thread. When you know someone from a foreign country, or someone who values a different religion, it is a lot more difficult to hate that person, or that country, or that religion. The Rotary Youth Exchange Program teaches tolerance and acceptance. It teaches these young people how to work through challenges, persevere and northlem solve.

And what about the **4Way Test delivered to the entire 7<sup>th</sup> grade population at the Summit Middle School last week**. Liz, and her team of nearly 50 volunteers Made Good Things Happen. Many of our volunteers have told me what an inspiring experience it was to participate. This is one example of how we *Make Good Things Happen* for teenagers.
