Instructions for Accessing Club Directory

To access the club directory, you must log in to our website. First, you need to click login at the top of the page. Your userid is your first initial and the last name followed by 4335 (ex. mknight4335). The password is the first initial and the last name (ex. mknight).

Next, click on Admin at the top of the page. On the left hand side, under My Club Runner, click on View Club Directory. You should also take the time to update your directory listing by following the instructions posted in the document entitled "Updating Your Directory Listing." Recap of 5/27 Meeting

The club was fortunate to host Chief Dave Parmley of Dillon Fire & Rescue, who spoke about the beetle kill in the county, and the resulting forest fire potential. Please click "more" to read a full recap of Tuesday's meeting!

According to Chief Parmley, currently there is an incident management team in place to respond to even the smallest fires. Police, fire fighters, search and rescue, EMS all have a role to play. Currently the county has 2 wild land engines and 4 other pieces of equipment that can respond to a wild land fire. There is a county wide evacuation plan in place. There is a plan in place on how to fight a wild land fire. The first priority is to keep the fire fighters safe. Houses without defensable space at the end of a road with one entrance and exit may not be saved. Several maps were shown showing the extent of the current beetle kill and where fire mitigation efforts are taking place. There isn't enough money in the budget to protect everything. He suggested visiting the Summit County website for more information.
