There is no doubt in my mind that the many messages, prayer chains, and lovely sentiments shared with me these last several days lit up the way for him as he entered God's embrace. He is now surrounded by those we have loved before, and watching over all of us from his new vantage point.

Dick's remains will be cremated, and we plan to have a mass and celebration of his life in Summit County in July. That was our home for 15 marvelous years, and where the richness of our friends and community will be of tremendous comfort to me and the family.

Our family found some peace when we received word that Dick's car was located, with no signs of foul play and all his things inside. The inner cranial hemorrhage was a natural occurrence; we can only surmise that as he was out and about last Friday afternoon, he realized something wasn't right, and that he went in search of help.

## #6 - THE 4-WAY TEST

One of the most widely printed and quoted statements of business ethics in the world is the Rotary "4-Way Test." It was created by Rotarian Herbert J. Taylor in 1932 when he was asked to take charge of the Chicago based Club Aluminum Company, which was facing bankruptcy Taylor looked for a way to save the struggling company mired in depression-caused financial difficulties. He drew up a 24-word code of ethics for all employees to follow in their business and professional lives. The 4-Way Test became the guide for sales, production, advertising and all relations with dealers and customers, and the survival of the company was credited to this simple philosophy.

Herb Taylor became president of Rotary International during 1954-55. The 4-Way Test was adopted by Rotary in 1943 and has been translated into more than 100 languages and published in thousands of ways. The message should be known and followed by all Rotarians. "Of the things we think, say or do:

1. Is it the TRUTH?

2. Is it FAIR to all concerned?
