2009 – (44 dinners Mar 3, 09 – Dec 29, 09), 8,962 meals served, 3162 to children average 203 per week, high 312 - Nov 10

2010 – 14,791 meals served, 3520 to children average 284 per week, high 401- Nov 30

2011 – 16,097 meals served, 2876 to children average 310, high 557 – Dec 13 (7 meals 400+)

2012 - 16,366 meals served, 2,627 to children (8 meals 400+, 2 meal 500+, average 315)

2013 - 7910 meals served, 1001 to children

I realize walk in freezers are not common household items but if anyone knows of a kitchen that is needing to get rid of their walk in freezer and would like to donate it to us or sell it to us very inexpensively we would love to know about it.
