## Community Dinner Update.....

Over the last year we have been given 4 used vacuum cleaners and we are very grateful for their donation. We are so hard on vacuums; however, that none of them lasted more than a few months! We have not been able to vacuum at all for the last two weeks. Now Bob and Nancy Follett have come through for us again and have bought us two new, bagless vacuums! 2009 - (44 dinners Mar 3, 09 - Dec 29, 09), 8,962 meals served, 3162 to children

average 203 per week, high 312 - Nov 10

2010 - 14,791 meals served, 3520 to children

average 284 per week, high 401- Nov 30

2011 – 16,097 meals served, 2876 to children

average 310, high 557 - Dec 13 (7 meals 400+)

2012 - 8709 meals served, 1,312 to children

19 dinners, average 370 meals served

(5 meals 400+, 1 meal 500+)

Last year, by the end of June 2011, we had served 7540 meals to adults and 1325 meals to children. The number of meals we are serving to children has remained steady but we have served over 15% more meals to adults in the same time period.
