As I very carefully held my new grandson for the first time this past Tuesday morning, I marveled at how all those fingers, toes, eyes, brain and so many other essential components had been created in harmony to form this amazing tiny person. It is truly a miracle how it all comes together for a baby to begin to function on his own at birth, with support from parents and others, and to go on to develop into a complex fellow human being with unique character and contributions to offer this world.

In recent years we have witnessed many Rotary 'miracles' start with very small beginnings and then expand rapidly beyond initial expectations into huge successes. The Shelter Box program, which has come to the rescue of so many who have been left homeless after major natural disasters around the world, began with the vision and action of a single small Rotary club in Wales. The program that gives a new dictionary to every third grade student, so well embraced locally by our own Literacy Committee, began in a single Rotary club in the eastern USA and spread rapidly across the whole country. Rotary's International Youth Exchange program began with the invitation by a Rotary club in Australia that brought one young Japanese girl to live and study in their community, not so long after the terrible events of WW2; it now involves more than 8,000 exchange students worldwide every year. Barely four years ago, Summit County Rotarian Deb Hage got the idea that we should and could provide a free community dinner every week, open to everyone - and 67,000 dinners later that popular project is going strong with an impressive network of sponsoring organizations and individuals.

Great ideas plus the energy and ability of Rotarians to make good things happen - it's a sure formula for creating our own miracles! Next time you have a big idea, kick it around with a few Rotary friends, and see what happens. You never know where it might take us!
