Satellites and UFOs

Beam me up, Scotty! Have you heard? We're launching our own little space odyssey right here in Summit County. The Club's Board has approved the concept of forming a "satellite club" and has set up a committee to work through the details of how that will be done. During the past two years, satellite clubs have been a pilot program for Rotary International. The pilots, which included one by the Boulder Rotary Club, were so successful that they gained early formal approval by RI this spring.

Satellite clubs tend to offer non traditional meeting times (late afternoon or evening), no meal during the meeting, lower dues structure, alternative meeting formats and content, and other variations determined by the local satellite members. Members of a satellite club are members of its sponsoring club and full members Rotary International. Most of the pilot satellite clubs have attracted new members who are young professionals with a keen interest in service, but with less flexibility in their work and family schedules and limited financial capacity. With the unique demographics in Summit County, we may also find interest among older and retired individuals.

It is likely that our satellite club would not include all of the 'traditional' elements of a typical Rotary weekly meeting. Its members will adopt what works for them.
