The Rotary Leadership Institute is designed to strengthen Rotary clubs through quality leadership education. Participants take three courses on three separate days, learning how to be a true Rotarian and a more effective member and leader in their clubs. The \$40 fee will be fully reimbursed by our club. Course content includes: level 1 the basics of being a Rotarian, level 2 applying the knowledge and skills attained to increase club effectiveness, and level 3 opening the door to higher Rotary service and critical examination of more complex issues. RLI also weaves leadership, service, and membership throughout all of the three courses.
