President's Message

We have been *Rotarians at Work* this first quarter of our Rotary Year. We've seen the vision, made a difference, served the hungry, read with young buddies, and are planning to distribute dictionaries to every 3rd grader in Summit County.

Your Board of Directors have also been busy budgeting the approximately \$83,000 dollars that we raised through our 2012 fundraising efforts. Thank you again to our committee chairs Stephanie and Tom for running the Car Raffle (our largest producing standalone fundraiser), Betty and Wendy, our BBQ Queens, and Rob Phipps and Tom French for keeping us on our frosty toes during the Ice Melt Contest. Last but not least, another giant thank you to Bill Sanders who in 2012 brought in as much as any single fundraiser in the form of corporate partner giving. We're always looking for new people to train under the current leadership for fundraising *and* for community service projects. Let us know of your interest, or talk to the current leaders for insight.

In addition to the \$83,000 our fundraising efforts earned, we also received close to \$30,000 in what we call "earmarked" monies. These donations are given to our Club to be used for specific projects like the Community Dinner (an annual budget of around \$25k), Troop Support (annually est. \$4000), RYLA (we'll be able to send 10-12 more students than we could have because of individual donations), Literacy, Scholarships to deserving and needing students, and the Community Care Clinic. All in all, you can be safe to say that our Club gives back to our community roughly \$100,000 annually. Now that's something to write home about!

At upcoming meetings, we will breakdown our budgeted giving amounts for 2013 more specifically, as well as share the results of our Visioning session.

Want to learn more about Rotary? Plan to attend RLI (Rotary Leadership Institute). Participants take 3 courses over time. Nov. 10, Jan. 26, and March 9 are the next three sessions held at Red Rocks Community College. No need to commit to all. Start with one. Our Club will pay the \$40 registration for any member wishing to attend. It's a fantastic way to learn what it really means to be a Rotarian. Talk to Rolo, Joni, Mary Anne, Butch or Rob Phipps – all "graduates" of RLI. Advance registration is required so mark your calendar and register now.
