We will celebrate with breakfast \& special program this coming Tuesday, Dec. $\mathbf{3 1}$ including real mimosas and musical entertainment. See you there!

A new year on the calendar, and halfway through our Rotary year! We've been busy and have accomplished much as a Club. Surely our Guatemala Literacy Project is as good as it gets! Past President and chief energizer bunny Joni Ellis travelled to Guatemala in early 2013 with several members of our Club, and she is the primary lead for the current GLP and grants. She, Jeff, Mary Anne, and others personally spread the word to our sister Clubs in 5450 and beyond. Joni reports the following amazing participation and financial achievements -
"Our Global Grant \#14-12387 is now officially submitted to TRF. By sharing your enthusiasm and giving your endorsements, cash from our own D- 5450 clubs plus DDF \& RI matches exceeded $\$ 55,000$. This is very exciting within our own District. Add over 90 clubs in North \& Central America, plus 17 Districts, and our GLP Global Grant total is $\mathbf{\$ 3 3 9 , 1 9 1}$ ! Objectives of our Global Grant:

* Primary school reading programs will benefit 159 teachers and approx. 4300 students in 29 schools.
* Textbooks will benefit 32 teachers and approx. 1300 students in 8 schools.
* The Computer Center will benefit approx. 150 students in 1 school.

It will likely be a couple months before we hear confirmation from TRF (The Rotary
Foundation). In the meantime, Mary Anne, Butch and I, along with a member of the Arvada Rotary Club will be traveling to Guatemala for 10 days in Jan/Feb 2014. We would be happy to report progress from the field upon our return. This project is obviously ongoing. With the commitment of many Rotarians, we will be helping Guatemalan children for years to come. Thank you all very much for your support of the Guatemala Literacy Project."
