DUES AMOUNT: Current membership dues are \$550 annually. Prorated dues for midyear membership are \$100.00 plus \$45 times the remaining number of months to June 30th.

PAYMENT PLANS: Annual dues (July 1 – June 30) may be paid all in one payment no later than June 15, 2021 or one payment of \$275 by 6/15/21 and a second payment of \$275 sixty days later. You also may pay \$100 upon notification of membership and \$45 per month for 10 months beginning on July 1, 2021.

HOW DUES ARE ALLOCATED

The \$550 dues amount is allocated as follows:

ROTARY INTERNATIONAL AVENUES OF SERVICE

- **CLUB SERVICE:** Rotary values fellowship and developing relationships. This committee creates opportunities for members and their families to connect socially and to share interests. It is also the business, publicity, and operations side of running the organization.
- **VOCATIONAL SERVICE:** Rotary provides opportunities for members with special skills, specific knowledge, and professional services to serve others in the community through utilization of these special talents. Activities include donating time to assist members of our community and doing member introductions to the Club and community through the Club's social media platforms. These activities also serve to demonstrate the highest levels of professionalism from our members.
- **COMMUNITY SERVICE:** Rotary's motto is Service Above Self, and local community service projects are the main avenue for achieving this objective. Whether it is assisting the Alameda Food Bank sort food or weeding the landscaped area around the Club's pavilion at the Jean Sweeney Open Space area, the Club is always looking for opportunities to serve the community. Members can submit their own project for Club recognition, propose a project that utilizes the full resources of the Club, or collaborate with other organizations to execute a community service project.
- **INTERNATIONAL SERVICE:** This is Community Service on an international scale to support Rotary's humanitarian work to promote peace, encourage multicultural understanding, and assist underdeveloped communities in providing the basic needs of clean water, nutrition, education, and shelter.
- **YOUTH SERVICES:** Youth are our future and this avenue provides opportunities for youth to learn leadership skills and supports youth activities that help the community both locally and internationally.
