450 Hygiene Kits for Puerto Rico hurricane victims.



Fred Pfeifer.....Thank You For Serving With Olathe Rotary Since July of 1986

I was raised on a farm in Cass County, Missouri, and have an Associate Degree from JCCC, a Bachelor of Business Administration (Accounting), and a Master of Business Administration from the University of Kansas. I am a Certified Public Accountant. In 1967, I moved to Olathe to accommodate a job opportunity with King Radio Corporation which I had begun in 1966. The company was only 7 years old at that time. I worked ten years for King Radio, beginning as a mechanical detail draftsman. My final position there was Manager of Engineering Services. I worked with Rotarian Keith Johnson and deceased former Olathe Rotarians Bob Dunn and Dick Johnson. The VP of Engineering in my last few years there was Gary Burrell who later co-founded Garmin.

After obtaining a business degree at night school I changed professions and began an auditing and accounting career with Touché Ross and Company (now Deloitte) in Kansas City in 1976. In 1979, I moved to a position with Gill Studios, Inc. in Lenexa, where I still work today. My initial responsibilities included product cost analysis and product pricing. I now serve as Senior Vice President – Finance. Gill Studios was founded in 1934 by Forrest P. Gill. The company which has approximately 400 employees owns a modern 300,000 square foot manufacturing and office facility at its Lenexa location. The company is still private owned by the Gill and Gilman families. Forrest Gill invented the bumper sticker shortly after WW II. It is still a core product along with other decals, labels and signage (think political campaign signs). Our products are sold nationwide by independent Promotional Product distributors and other re-sellers. The company does not sell directly to end users. You see one of our decals every Wednesday as our table centerpiece. Several years ago, Gill Studios donated 23,000 bumper stickers to promote Polio Plus. The bumper stickers were distributed to clubs throughout our Rotary zone through the efforts of Wes McCoy.
